Re : Strike by the State Electricity Supply Workers' Union

Shri Maneswer Boro asked :

*12. Will the Minister-in-charge of Power (Electricity) be pleased to state —

(a) Whether it is a fact that the State Electricity Supply Workers' Union went on strike from 12th June to 17th June 1970 ?

(b) If so the reason thereof ?

(c) Whether Government propose to fulfil their demands ?

(d) What is the total loss incurred by other industries of Assam as a result of failure of power ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma [Minister, Power (Electricity), etc.] replied :

12. (a)— Yes.

(b)— The Union submitted a 37-point Charter of Demands to the Assam State Electricity Board which the Board could not concede due to many of the demands being not considered reasonable.

The strike was resorted to as a result.

(c)—Although Government is not directly concerned with the fulfilment of their demands, there was discussion between the Minister, Power and Industries and the representatives of the Union on 20th June 1970, following which the strike was called off. Since then, as a result of bilateral discussions between the Board and the Union substantial progress has been made in the settlement of most of the points in dispute.

(d)—The Board has no information about loss incurred by other industries of Assam as a result of failure of power.

শ্রীবিশ্বদেৱ শৰ্মা— দাবী বিলাকৰ সকলোই justified নহয় ইয়াৰে কিছুমান আমি Industrial Tribunal লৈ refer কৰিছো। যদিও এইটো প্ৰত্যক্ষ ভাবে আমাৰ কাম নহয় তথাপি মাজতে মই intervene কৰি strike টো called off কৰালো আৰু দাবী বিলাক Tribunal লৈ refer কৰিছো কিন্তু Work charge employe ৰ permanentৰ কাৰণে তেওঁলোক কেইবা হাজাৰো হোৱাত Service record পোৱাত সময় লৈছে। কিন্তু দাবী বিলাক মানি লোৱা হৈছে।

শ্রীমেন্ধৰ বড়ো— এইটো কথা সচানেকি অসম চৰকাৰে কেন্দ্ৰীয় চৰকাৰক অনুৰোধ কৰি ধৰ্মঘটকাৰী সকলৰ বিৰুদ্ধে আইন জাৰি কৰাইছে?

শ্রীবিশ্বদেৱ শৰ্মা— Essential Service declare কৰি আইন জাৰি কৰা হৈছিল। কিয়নো Electricity বন্ধ হৈ গলে গোটেই Industry য়ে ঝুঁ হৈ যায়। সেই কাৰণে আমি আলোচনা কৰি Ressential Service declare কৰি যাতে Strike কৰিব নোৱাৰে তাৰ কাৰণে এইটো কৰা হ'ল তত্ৰাচ Strike কৰিলে।

শ্রীমেন্ধৰ বড়ো— নায্য দাবী পূৰণ কৰিবৰ কাৰণে যোৱা দাবীকাৰী সকলৰ বিৰুদ্ধে আইন জাৰি কৰাটো চৰকাৰৰ সমীচিন হৈছে জানো?

শ্রীবিশ্বদেৱ শৰ্মা— হয় সমীচিন হৈছে।

শ্রীলক্ষ্যধৰ চৌধুৰী— আমাৰ এই প্ৰশ্নটো উদ্যোগ কৰ্মী সকলে যোৱা বাৰ ধৰ্মঘট কৰা বিষয়ে। এই কথা জানিব পাৰো নেকি যে অহা ৩১ মাৰ্চৰ পৰা পুনৰ এই কৰ্মী সকলে ধৰ্মঘট কৰাৰ সিদ্ধান্ত লৈছে?

শ্রীবিশ্বদেৱ শৰ্মা— হয়। Ultimatum দিছে।

শ্রীলক্ষ্যধৰ চৌধুৰী— এই বিষয়ে চৰকাৰে কি সিদ্ধান্ত লৈছে? যদি ধৰ্মঘট হয় অসমৰ উদ্যোগ বিভাগ আৰু বিভিন্ন বিভাগৰ বিশেষ ক্ষতি নহবনে? বৰ্ডৰ পক্ষৰ পৰা বাতৰি কাকতত যিটো গোহাৰি Statement প্ৰকাশ কৰিছে তাৰ পৰা দেখা যায় যে বৰ্ডে যুদ্ধংদেহি মনোভাব লৈছে, এই বিষয়ে মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয়ে কি কয়?

শ্রীবিশ্বদেৱ শৰ্মা— ইতিমধ্যে Unionৰ লগত যোগাযোগ কথা বতৰা চলিছে আৰু কাগজতো ওলাইছে। Union যিবিলাক দাবী কৰিছে এই বিলাক

কিছু মীমাংসা কৰা হৈছে। কিছুমান Tribunal লৈ গৈছে আৰু কিছুমান National Wage Boardৰ সিদ্ধান্ত অনুযায়ী বিহিত ব্যৱস্থা হাতত লৈছে সেইবাবে Stike টো most unreasonable.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, The first strike was launched by the wotkers of the State Electricity Board on 17th June 1970 and today is the 16th March, 1971. Before 17th June 1970 a notice was served and representations were made to the State Electricity Board the waskess union to concede their demands. Finding that the authority paid no heed to their demands, the workers resorted to strike. Sir, may I know from the honourable Minister even after such a long time why effective steps have not been taken by the authority for implementation of their demands?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : Sir, first part of the Question that effective steps have not taken is not correct. I personally interviewed the members of the Workers' Union and I had discussion with them. There are certain demands which required long scrutiny for which there is delay in settling the matter. It is not that the Board is not sympathetic. It is the nature of demands which require some time.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, the wage board has given recommendations long ago. May I know from the hon'ble Minister why it requires such a long time to finalise the matter?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : Immediately on receipt of the recommendations, the board has started scrutiny and substantial progress has been made in the settlement of the demands.

Shri Debeswar Sarmah : এটা কথা দেখা গৈছে যে শ্রীপ্ৰফুল্ল বৰুৱাৰ সভাপতিত্বত ২/৩ বছৰৰ আগতে এখন Enquiry Commission বহিছিল। তাৰ Report এতিয়াও দাখিল কৰা নাই কিয় ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : তাৰ Report অহা এপ্ৰিল মাহত দাখিল কৰা হব।

Shri Dulal Chandra Borua : কিছুমান matter Industrial Tribunal লৈ Reffer কৰা হৈছে। মই জনাত কিছুমান matter Industrial Tribunal লৈ Refer নকৰাকৈ যে Board এ সিদ্ধান্ত লব পাৰে। এতিয়া মই মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয়ৰ পৰা জানিব বিচাৰিছো যে যিবিলাক Industrial Tribunal লৈ Refer নকৰাকৈ বৰ্ডে সিদ্ধান্ত লব পাৰে সেই বিলাক Industrial Tribunal লৈ পঠাব লাগে কিয় ? যি বিলাক বিষয় Industrial Tribunal লৈ Refer নকৰাকৈ হয় সেই বিলাকৰ কিমান কাম কৰা হৈছে বা কোন কোন বিষয়ে Industrial Tribunal লৈ Refer কৰা হৈছে আৰু কেতিয়া কৰা হৈছে।

Shri Biswadev Sarma : এই ‘পইণ্ট’ কেইটা মোৰ হাতত নাই। Concerning absorption of Muster Roll and work-charged employees and permanency and confirmation of regular employees, the Board had earlier taken necessary decisions. এই কথাত মই ৰাজী আছো। Those decisions, in certain respects an advance on the recommendations of the National Wage Board, are in the process of implementation requiring detailed verification of the service particulars of a large number of workers which involves time. এনেকুৱা কিছুমান কথাত verification কৰোঁতে দেৰী হৈছে। তাতে কৰ্মী সকল অধৈৰ্য্য হৈ পৰিছে।

Shri Sarat Chandra Rabha : আজি দুবছৰ আগতে কৰ্মী বিলাকৰ যিবিলাক দাবী সেই বিলাক বিবেচনা কৰাৰ কাৰণে Tribunal লৈ দিয়া হৈছে। আৰু Tribunal এ ৰায় দিয়াৰ পাচত management এ 8% টকাকৈ বনাচ দিছিল। এই Tribunal ৰ ৰায় management ক নামানিবলৈকে দিছিলনেকি ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : সদস্য ডাডৰীয়াই ঠিকেই কৈছে। এই Tribunal এ ৰায় দিয়াৰ পাচতে 8% টকাকৈ বনাচ দিয়া হৈছিল। কিন্তু তেখেত সকলে বাৰে বাৰে সেই কথাটো উত্থাপন কৰা দেখি এই বিষয়টো Industrial Tribunal লৈ Refer কৰা হ'ল।

Shri Sainen Medhi : মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয়ে কৈছে যে ইলেকট্ৰিক কৰ্মীৰ কিছুমান দাবী ইতিমধ্যে Tribunal লৈ পঠাইছে আৰু কিছুমান দাবী মানি লৈছে। মই জানিব খুজিছো যে যেতিয়া যোৱাবাৰ ধৰ্মঘট কৰিলে তেতিয়াই সেইবোৰ দাবী Tribunal লৈ refer কৰিছিলনে? এতিয়া আকৌ ধৰ্মঘটৰ ভাবুকি দিয়াত কতপক্ষই এতিয়াহে সেইবোৰ Tribunal লৈ পঠাইছে।

Shri Biswadev Sarma : ধৰ্মঘটৰ ভাবুকি দিয়াৰ আগতেই এই বিলাক Tribunal লৈ পঠাৱা থৈছে।

Shri Kehoram Hazarika : কিছুমান কৰ্মীয়ে ৫/৬/৭৮ বছৰ কাম কৰি থকাৰ পাচতো অস্থায়ী হৈ আছে। এই বিলাকক স্থায়ী কৰাৰ কিয়া ব্যৱস্থা কৰিব নোৱাৰিলে ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : চাকৰীত স্থায়ী কৰাৰ কাম চৰকাৰে নকৰে। Electricity Board এহে কৰে। কাক কাক স্থায়ী কৰিব লাগে এই বিষয়ে বৰ্ডেহে ভাবিব।

Shri Sarat Chandra Goswami : এই স্কুল দুখনে স্বীকৃতি পোৱা নাই বাবে অৰ্থ সাহায্যও পোৱা নাই।

Shri Pitsing Konwar : মই এইটো কথা জানিব খুজিছো যে এই বিষ্ণুপুৰ স্কুল খনত T.A.D. এ ১৯৬৯/৭০ চনত ২৬৬ টকা গ্ৰাণ্ট দিছিল। এই T.A.D. বিভাগটো চৰকাৰী বিভাগ হয়নে নহয় ?

Shri Sarat Chandra Goswami : মই এইটো কথা নাজানো খবৰ কৰিহে জনাব পাৰিম।

M. Shamsul Huda : আমি বাৰে বাৰে কৈ আহিছো যে মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয় সকলে যেতিয়া কিবা প্ৰশ্নৰ উত্তৰ দিবলৈ আহে তেতিয়া সকলো তথ্যপাতি জানি আহিব লাগে। কিন্তু এতিয়া দেখা গৈছে যে তেখেতে জানি অহা নাই। গতিকে প্ৰশ্নটো স্থগিত ৰাখিব লাগে।

Mr. Speaker : He will supply the information.

M. Shamsul Huda : খবৰ সংগ্ৰহ কৰি পিচত জনোৱাৰ কথা নহয়। কাৰণ আমি আগৰ দৰে একেটা প্ৰশ্নৰেই উত্তৰ পাবলৈ অহা নাই।

Gratuitous grant আদিৰ কাৰণে লোন দিব লাগে। সেই কাৰণে তেখেতক মই অনুৰোধ কৰিছো যে প্ৰশ্নটো স্থগিত ৰাখিব লাগে।

Shri Maneswar Boro : “হাতে হালোৱা সংঘই বড়ো জন-জাতীয় লোকে উৎপাদন কৰা খেতি ফছল বলপূৰ্বক কাটি নিবলৈ গৈ বড়ো ৰাইজৰ চিচুপানী M. E. School আৰু বিষ্ণুপুৰ L.P. School দুয়োখনকে জুই লগাই দিলে”। কি কাৰণে জনজাতীয় লোকে কৰা খেতি বলপূৰ্বক ভাবে কাটি নিলে। এই মাটি চৰকাৰী মাটিনে কাৰোবাৰ পট্টাৰ মাটি ?

Shri Sarat Chandra Goswami : এই প্ৰশ্নৰ উত্তৰ শিক্ষা বিভাগৰ পৰা জনাব পৰা নহব।

Shri Bhubaneswar Barman : মন্ত্ৰী ডাঙৰীয়াই গোটেই প্ৰশ্নটোৰ উত্তৰত হয় বুলি কৈছে। আৰু বাকী খিনি নাজানো বুলি কৈছে। সেই কাৰণে আমাৰ মাননীয় সদস্য শ্ৰীহৃদা ডাঙৰীয়াই কোৱাৰ দৰে প্ৰশ্নটো স্থগিত ৰাখিব লাগে। খেলি মেলি উত্তৰ দিয়াটো ভাল নহয়।

Shri Sarat Chandra Goswami : চেচাপানী আৰু বিষ্ণুপুৰ এই স্কুল দুখনত জুই লগা কথাটো সঁচা।

Shri Hiralal Patwary : আমাৰ মাননীয় সদস্য শ্ৰীবড়ো ডাঙৰীয়াই কৈছে যে বলপূৰ্বক ভাবে ধান কাটিবলৈ গৈ স্কুল দুখনত জুই লগাই দিছে। কিন্তু মই জানিব বিচাৰিছো বলপূৰ্বক ভাবে কিয় ধান কাটিব লগা হল ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma : জুই-লগাতো জানে। বলপূৰ্বক ভাবে ধান কাটিছেনেকি নাজানে।

শ্ৰীৰং চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী— অধ্যক্ষ মহোদয় উত্তৰত এইটো স্পষ্ট আছে। বিষ্ণুপুৰ আৰু চিচুপানী স্কুলত জুই লগা কথাটো সঁচা। সাহায্য আদি দিয়াৰ কথাটো শিক্ষা বিভাগৰ কথা নহয়।

মিষ্টাৰ স্পীকাৰ— হাতে হালোৱা সংঘই বড়ো জনজাতীয় লোকে উৎপাদন কৰা খেতি ফছল বলপূৰ্বক কাটি নিবলৈ গৈ বড়ো ৰাইজৰ চিচুপানী এম, ই স্কুল আৰু বিষ্ণুপুৰ এল, পি স্কুল দুয়োখনকে জুই জ্বলাই দিয়া কথাটোকে উত্তৰ দিলে কিন্তু এই বিষয়ে শিক্ষা বিভাগে কিবা তদন্ত চলাইছেনে নাই ইয়াৰ উত্তৰ দিয়া হোৱা নাই।

শ্ৰীশৰৎ চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী— ইয়াৰ উত্তৰ (খ) আৰু (গ) আছে। শিক্ষা বিভাগে কোনো তদন্ত চলোৱা নাই, তদন্ত পুলিচে চলাইছে।

শ্ৰীকামিনী মোহন শৰ্মা — এই বিষ্ণুপুৰ আৰু চিচুপানী স্কুল দুখন জুই লগাই পুৰি পেলোৱাতো সঁচা আৰু ইয়াৰ পাছত তাৰ ল'ৰা ছোৱালী বিলাকে পঢ়াশুনাৰ সুযোগ সুবিধা পাইছেনে নাই তাৰ তদন্ত কৰিছেনে? এই দুখন স্কুলৰ দায়িত্ব বহন কোনে কৰিছে? এই বড়ো জনজাতীয় লোক সকলৰ স্কুল দুখন ক'ত বহিল মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয় যদি ঘটনাতো যথাযথ ভাৱে নাজানে তেন্তে আমাক উত্তৰ দিয়াটো চালাকি কৰাহে হব।

শ্ৰীশৰৎ চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী— এই স্কুল দুখনে এতিয়াও বিভাগীয় স্বীকৃতি পোৱা নাই। গতিকে বিভাগে স্কুল দুখনৰ সমন্ধে নাজানে।

শ্ৰীকেহৌৰাম হাজৰিকা— বিভাগীয় সাহায্য পোৱা নাই বাবেই চৰকাৰে এই সম্পৰ্কে কোনো সাহায্য আগবঢ়োৱাৰ কথা চিন্তা কৰা নাই। মই মন্ত্ৰীমহোদয়ক সুধিব খেজো যে, এই ল'ৰা ছোৱালীবোৰক শিক্ষাদান কৰাতো চৰকাৰৰ নৈতিকতা হয়নে নহয়? এই সম্পৰ্কে চৰকাৰে কি কৰ্তব্য বা দায়িত্ব পালন কৰিছে? এইটো কথা জনাব লাগে।

শ্ৰীশৰৎ চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী— ল'ৰা ছোৱালীক শিক্ষা দিয়াতো চৰকাৰৰ দায়িত্ব। যেতিয়া স্কুল লিপি ভুক্ত হয় তেতিয়া নৈতিক দায়িত্ব পালন কৰিবৰ কাৰণে স্বকীয় কাৰ্য্যপন্থা হাতত লোৱা হয়। যিবিলাক লিপি ভুক্ত স্কুল নহয় সেইবিলাকত চৰকাৰে সাহায্য দিব নোৱাৰে।

শ্ৰীকামিনী মোহন শৰ্মা— এই স্কুল বিলাকক সাহায্য নিদিয়াৰ কাৰণ কি? এই ল'ৰা ছোৱালী, ছাত্ৰছাত্ৰী ভাৰতবৰ্ষৰ নাগৰিক নহয়নেকি? অসমৰ ছাত্ৰছাত্ৰী নহয়নেকি? তেন্তে এই চৰকাৰৰ নৈতিকতা ক'ত থাকিল। স্কুল দুখন পুৰি ছাই হৈ গ'ল অথচ এই স্কুল দুখনত কোনো মঞ্জুৰী দিয়া হোৱা নাই। গতিকে এই চৰকাৰ দায়িত্ব জ্ঞানহীন চৰকাৰ হয়নে নহয়।

শ্রীসোনেশ্বৰ বৰা : অনুমোদন নোপোৱা কথাটো সঁচা নহয়। Article ২৭৫ত এই ২খন স্কুলৰ বাহিৰেও আৰু ৬খন স্কুলক সাহায্য দিয়া হৈছিল। এই ঘটনা সংক্ৰান্তত আৰু ৬খন স্কুল জুলোৱা হৈছিল এই কথাটো ভালকৈ তদন্ত নকৰিলে গোটেই কথাটো ওলাই নপৰে। এই স্কুল ৬খন গৱৰ্ণমেণ্টৰ পুলিচে জ্বলাইছে। নগাসীমান্তত এই ঘটনা লৈ এটা বেবেৰিবাং অৱস্থা চলি আছে।

শ্রীশৰৎ চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী : এইটো মই পিছত জনাম।

শ্রীঅতুল চন্দ্ৰ গোস্বামী : এই দুখন স্কুলত T. A. D. য়ে গ্ৰাণ্ট দিছিল অৱশ্যে শিক্ষা বিভাগৰ গ্ৰাণ্ট দিয়া হোৱা নাই। এই স্কুল ২খনে ২০ হাৰাৰ বাবে দৰ্খাস্ত দিছিলনে নাই মন্ত্ৰী মহোদয়ে জনাবনে ?

Mr. Speaker: Sufficient number of supplementaries have been put on this question. According to rules, only six supplementaries are to be allowed. If the hon. members want to put further question, then I will allow half-an-hour discussion on this question. Now question No.4

(Several Members from the Opposition rose to speak.)

Mr. Speaker: I have already told you that I will allow half-an-hour discussion on this question, if you want.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua: It is not possible on our part to convert every question into a subject matter for discussion under Rule 50. The hon. Member has given due notice of this question and therefore we expect that full

details regarding this question should be furnished by the Minister. Yesterday also we found that the Minister of State for Education confused himself and to-day also he has expressed his helplessness. It is not a correct procedure to discuss every Question under Rule 50. This is not the way to satisfy the Members. The main object of putting Question is to elicit information but it seems that the Government has failed to satisfy the Members with the details. We want to know why the required information is not furnished by the Minister of State Education although the Question was given long ago ?

Mr. Speaker : As the hon. Members have alleged, my only authority is to request the Minister to give exact reply which is sought in the Question. The Minister should have full records at his disposal and reply accordingly, and therefore, I would request that in future Ministers should get themselves fully posted with all necessary information so that there may not be any confusion as regards their reply. Such things should not happen in future also.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy (Minister, Finance):

One Question would arise as a result of your ruling. If in a Question pertaining to the Education Department supplementary Questions are put for eliciting information with regard to (a) law and order, i. e. Police Department, and (b) with regard to Revenue Department, then obviously it would be appreciated that the Education Department would not be in a position to collect all the facts. The proper procedure, therefore, would be, if answers are required with regard to these two Departments, separate Questions shall

have to be directed to these Departments. In this Question two points have been raised (1) Whether the T. A. Department allot funds. Minister has also agreed that he would enquire; the second Question is with regard to the procedure. Whether procedurally it is true of grants by T. A. Department are made from the Education Department, and if so, how the Education Department could plead that they did not know. On these points naturally the Education Minister will make a reply.

Shri Phani Bora: Minister, Finance, has just now stated that since in connection with this Question certain other Questions relating to other departments are also cropping up, the Questioner should have directed these Questions to the different departments like the Police and Revenue Department. This proposition cannot be accepted. The Question is very clear. It is the duty of the Department of Education to get information from the other allied Departments and furnish them to the House. The Education Department should have brought the relevant information from the Police Department as to in what stage the enquiry is. The Education Department should have brought other relevant information from the Revenue Department, and being equipped with all the information the Education Department should have been able to give proper answer. The State Minister in charge of Education has just now stated that this is under Police enquiry. Our information is that it is not only under enquiry but Police has filed a case and some people have been remanded to custody. Is it not that the Government is one; Is it that the Police Department is a different

Government; the Revenue Department a different Government and the Education is yet another Government. Is it not the collective responsibility of all the departments? Therefore, Sir, I would request you to reject the proposition made by the Finance Minister.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy : The answer is being given on a point of order raised by Shri Barman. (Interruptions: we are discussing a point of order.)

Mr. Speaker : We are discussing a point of order raised by Shri Barman.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy : The point which I made was that Questions are directed towards particular departments for particular information. So far as the answers relating to the Education Department they have given. The

only two points on the Education Department answers have not been given are (1) whether the grant from the T. A. Department was given at all, and (2) whether procedurally it is true that T&D grants should be conducted through the D.P.I., if so, how the Education Department can say 'they do not know'. These are the two Questions arising out of the answers. The other Question which has now been raised by Shri Bora is a wider question. He says that if in a particular Question three or four departments are involved then the Minister shall be under the compulsion to reply to all the questions relating to the different departments. It is known to you as well as to the House that the Government is organised in a particular way. A particular Minister looks into the files of his own department; he does not look into the files of other departments. It would also not be humanly possible to look into the files of other departments. Therefore, if a question incidentally raises a point as to whether a police enquiry is pending or not, he will naturally ask the Police Department as to whether an enquiry is pending or not. The Police Department will inform him that an enquiry is pending. But for further suppleментарies arising out of the answer it will not be possible to answer because these files will not be sent to him. Therefore, all incidental questions relating to other departments cannot be answered. That is the point which I made.

Shri Phani Bora : Mr. Speaker, Sir, I know our Finance Minister was a debator and still he is a debator. The point is, it is not a debating point, it is a point as

clear as water, as clear as day light. Minister would have replied that it was burnt under such and such circumstances, that would have been sufficient relating to that, and further supplementary could not have been answered - I understand that. Now here in (ঘ) যদি তদন্ত কৰিছে তেনেহলে তদন্তৰ ফলাফল কি হ'ল, ক্ষতি-গ্রস্ত স্কুল সমূহে ক্ষতিপূৰণ হিচাবে চৰকাৰী আৰ্থিক সাহায্য পাবনে? To that the answer is - it is under Police investigation পুলিচে কাকো দোষী সাব্যস্ত কৰিব পৰা নাই। উক্ত স্কুল দুখন এতিয়াও বিভাগীয় স্বীকৃতি পোৱা নাই, আৰু সেই কাৰণে কোনো অনুদান নাপায়। I have heard what the Minister said. The Minister said, 'it is under Police enquiry.' এটি স্বৰং (গ)তহে মই কব নোৱাৰো। কাৰণ মোৰ হাতত উত্তৰ নাই। মই মাত্ৰ শুনিছোহে। When he knows that it is under Police enquiry, he should have known it also at what stage the enquiry is. In this connection some people have been remanded to custody and already certain action has been taken at least that answer could have been given.

Shri Biswadev Sarma : পুলিচে কাকো দোষী সাব্যস্ত কৰিব পৰা নাই।

Shri Dulal Barua : Sir, everything has become confused.

Mr. Speaker : Rule 36 says "A question must relate to a matter of administration for which the Government is responsible. Its purpose shall be the eliciting of information or suggesting action on a matter of public importance."

It is a matter of administration. Now I refer to Rule 50. To get an exhaustive reply to the points raised, I can allow half an hour discussion. Here two or three Departments are involved in the question. In that case the portion relating to the concerning Department should be referred to that Department, and so far as the supplementaries are concerned it is expected that the Department which is directly concerned with the matter should obtain the details and the relevant information for reply. So at the time of putting the question, it should be seen that the question relates to a particular Department so as to enable the Minister-in-charge to give an exhaustive reply.

Shri Atul Chandra Goswami : Sir, the questions should be gone through carefully and refer such matters to the respective Departments for reply.

Shri Debeswar Sarmah : Sir, I want to make a submission. The statement of the hon. Finance Minister has taken us to a wider field. Sir, you have rightly ruled that when a question is put by a Member, the Minister should come prepared in all its aspects to give reply. That was, I submit, the only proper direction that could be given, and if the Minister does not come prepared and he fails to satisfy certain point, he may ask for notice, or he may say that he will reply to it on a later date. Now the hon. Finance Minister has stated that when a question involves more than one departments concerning several Ministers, what is to be done. It is not for the Member to split it up or to discern. In this case, in the present question. হাতে হালোরা সংঘই বড়ো জনজাতিয় লোকে উৎপাদন করা খেতি ফছল বলপূর্বক

The main question is whether the school was burnt and the subsequent question (Kha) is - was there any enquiry by the Education Department and thirdly if there was any enquiry, whether any compensation was paid. I am only illustrating from this question. Now, Sir, what is the duty of a Member of this House. He has sent a question and your Secretariat scrutinized it. The responsibility is of the Speaker; the Secretary or other officers may scrutinize it, split it or correct it or reconstruct the question in a different way, but it is ultimately the responsibility of the Speaker to allow a question or not. Sir, you will concede to it. Now what are we to do in such a case. The Finance Minister Lok Sabha. There also when certain question involves several Ministries, that Ministry, to which the question primarily applies, gives the reply. If more important matters are involved, then the Prime Minister or a senior Minister who is in charge takes it over. Now, Sir, with due respect I submit that hon. Finance Minister, Shri Tripathy in exposition of his view of this matter is less than fair to this House. What the Member will do ? How will a Member deal with a question like this.

Here it is the Chief Minister or somebody who holds the responsibility for the time being may answer. Sri Tripathy,

Finance Minister is expected to deal with this question to-day. It will be less than fair towards him if we expect him to deal with all the aspect of the case, because he has not seen the Police file or he has not seen the Revenue file and so he cannot reply. But, Sir, the proposition he has advanced is unacceptable to the House and you cannot concede to it. If you concede to such a proposition, it will take away an important right of the Member.

Re : Dangar Bridge

Shri Pitsing Konwar asked :

*14. Will the Minister-in-charge of Public Works Department (Roads and Buildings) be pleased to state —

(a) Whether the Executive Engineer, Public Works Department (Roads and Buildings) has been directed to prepare a plan and estimate of the bridge known as Dangar Bridge on Azarbari Amchoi Road which has been left unconstructed since the 2nd Five-Year Plan period ?

(b) If the reply to (a) above be in the affirmative then whether the plan and estimate have been submitted to Government for due consideration ?

(c) If the reply to (b) above be in the affirmative then when the plan and estimate have been submitted to Government for due consideration ?

(d) Whether Government be pleased to expedite the matter during this financial year ?

Shri Altaf Hossain Mazumder [Minister, Public Works Department (Roads and Buildings)] replied :

14. (a) Yes, if the Hon'ble Member meant Durulajan bridge as Dangar Bridge.

(b) & (c) The estimate has been received on 3rd December 1970 but the same has been returned to the Executive Engineer, Nowgong West Division for resubmission after meeting certain modification and clarification.

(d) Yes, subject to availability of fund.

(b)—An Officer may remain five years in one place.

(c) Whether it is a fact that he is a resident of Silchar Town and his brothers and his sisters and other relations also reside there ?

(d) Whether Government received requests from any official quarters about the desirability of enforcing the normal rules of 3 years transfer in his case in view of his developing a kind of vested interest in his home district and siding with parties in the various panchayats and thus hampering the healthy growth of panchayat ?

(e) Why an exception is being made in his case ?

(f) When he will be transferred ?

Shri Debendra Nath Hazarika (Minister of State, Panchayat and C. D.) replied :

1. (a)—Since 9th July 1966.

(b)— An Officer may remain five years in one place.

(c)— Shri Nag is a displaced person from East Pakistan and not yet settled anywhere. One of his brother resides at Silchar and another at Gauhati. His relatives are residing in different places within and outside Assam including Silchar.

(d)— Yes, only from the hon. Member. The matter is under examination.

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Now, Sir, we found that the money required in connection with execution of Court decree; but detail statement of expenditure has not been furnished in the first item.

DISCUSSION ON THE SUPPLEMENTARY STATEMENT OF EXPENDITURE CHARGED ON THE CONSOLIDATED FUND OF THE STATE FOR 1970-71.

* Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Item No. 1 Now, Sir, while discussing on the supplementary statement of expenditure charged on the Consolidated fund of the State for the year 1970-71, I want to make certain observation. If you go through, at least, the list of such kind of demands for the year 1970-71, which was moved in year 1970 November Session then you will find that this has practically depicted a very horrible picture on the part of the Government, specially the Finance Department as well as the Department of Law. Here we have got 10 items of expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund for which demands are placed by the Government. Yet, almost all the items i.e. out of 11 items 10 items are for the amount for the respective heads. Here in item No. 1 "9 Land Revenue" an amount of Rs. 4,589.95 is required for satisfying the Court's decree in connection with a Money Execution Case in the Court of Sadar Munsiff, Gauhati. Provision made in the current year's budget has almost been exhausted leaving a balance of only Rs. 418. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation for the balance amount of Rs. 4,172. The amount of Rs. 2,363 is required for satisfying a decree in connection with acquisition of some land at Chapor. Funds are not available under appropriate head. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation to meet the decretal amount.

Now, Sir, we found that the money required in connection with execution of Court decree; but detail statement of expenditure has not been furnished in the first item. What is the nature of the case, why the amount is necessary that has not been explained. More so, the amount of Rs. 4630 is required, the details of which are not furnished.

Here in the item No. 2 "II-Taxes on Vehicles" — an amount of Rs 1,130 is required to satisfy the decree of the Asstt. District Judge, Gauhati, in connection with a money suit. As there was no budget provision, no detail statement of expenditure has so far been given which is exactly necessary to give a clear picture to the House about the nature of expenditure. This is lacking in the statement

Now coming to the other decretal case on item No.4 an additional amount of Rs 3,684 is required to satisfy the Decrees of the Court in connection with certain money execution cases. As there was no provision in the Budget, advances from Contingency Fund were taken to meet the expenditure. Hence the Supplementary appropriation to regularise the advance taken. Here also details are lacking. We have pointed out to Government, time without numbers, that unless the House is apprised of the full details and nature of the decretal cases it is difficult on our part to take or give proper observation in certain cases.

Again in item No. 5, that an amount of Rs 449 is required to satisfy the decree of the Court of Small Causes, Calcutta in connection with a money suit. The amount was taken as advance from the Contingency Fund. Hence the Supplementary appropriation to regularise the same. This is also a money suit. But details are lacking.

In item No. 6 an additional amount of Rs 85,420 is required for meeting the decretal cost in connection with acquisition of land for Fishery in village Ulubari, Mouza Panbari, Gauhati. There is no provision in the current year's budget for such expenditure and hence the amount is proposed to be provided by supplementary appropriation. Here also details are not given. Unless these are not given it is difficult on our part to understand for which the money is demanded over.

Now, the amount under item No. 7 required to satisfy the decree of the Court in connection with a Money Execution Case in the Court of Assistant Judge, Nowgong. The amount was obtained from Contingency Fund. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation for regularisation of the advance taken from the Contingency Fund. Here also details are lacking.

Now, item No. 8 The amount of Rs 40,731 is required to satisfy decrees of the Court. There is no provision in the budget for the purpose. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation. Details are lacking here too.

Item No. 9 - Several persons whose lands were acquired for the Gauhati Refinery preferred appeals against the compensation awarded to them. Three such cases were disposed of by the Appellate Courts awarding a further compensation of Rs 3,10,984. As the appellate orders were received after the Budget was finalised no provision could be made. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation.

Sir, in this a bad smell is there. Our information is that this expenditure is required in the year 1956-57 for

the Refinery and almost all the cases were finalised by the Court. Even then, there are people to whom compensation was not given. I am sure that my information is correct and that maximum amount has been given directly or indirectly by taking back-door policy to the persons who happen to be the No. 2 socialist. This has been so with several persons. Compensation was given to those high-up persons who happen to be leader of socialism, socialist democratic society, socialist musks of different places inside and outside the State even of Delhi. May I know from the Hon'ble Finance Minister, why appropriate action should not be taken by the House for not paying the compensation properly for the land acquired for the Oil Refinery? There are some people who were not given a single compensation, while there are some people who in the name of socialist leaders, who delivers tall talks of socialism are enjoying the benefit of compensation. Now, Sir, why the Govt. of Assam remains silent about giving details. Are we not to suspect the back-door policy adopted by the Government. Government should give us the explanation. I want to know number of persons, the Zamindars, who were given compensation and what are the percentage of distribution of compensation, why the people were over-thrown, why a particular individual now even after a lapse.

How, after a lapse of so many years, after a lapse of 20 years, what we have seen? It will not be unparliamentary, I think, if I say that this man has power to influence even over the judiciary and by exercising his influence taking advantage of his position in the party in power has been

hoodwinking the Government which advocates socialism, a socialistic pattern of society, and sucking the blood of the people. He is taking the help of the Government machinery and exploiting the commoners. Shri Tripathi, Finance Minister woes an explanation whether this Government is meant to make the rich richer and the Government machinery is meant for sucking the blood of the commoners ? Whether this Government is meant for giving benefit to the high-ups only at the cost of the common people ? Unless this is clarified to-day here, I say we will revolt. You may be pleased to say that you are having an absolute majority in the centre. But the time is numbered and the mask will be opened ; people will come forward and will unmask the swindlers ; they will decide the course of action themselves. Why no mention has been made about the particular person whom the amount was granted. You are very jubilant over the election result that the people have accepted the policy followed by Indira Gandhi. Yes., it there. But it is temporary. If the people who are wearing the mask of socialism and inside them is the exploiters of common people do not change their nefarious practice the time will come then people will take action. Wait for six months ! We will show, the people of Assam and the people of India will show that they nicely know these exploiters who are wearing the mask of socialism and you will realise when their heads will be thrown off. Nobody can escape from this catastrophe.

Now Sir, coming to item No, 10 ; an amount of Rs. 12, 052.30 is required for satisfying a decree of the

Assistant District Judge, Gauhati in connection with a land acquisition case. There being no provision in the budget, the amount was taken as an advance from the Contingency fund. Hence the Supplementary Appropriation to regularise the same". No details have been furnished. Again, coming to item No. 11: The amount of Rs. 2417 is required to satisfy the Decrees of the Court in connection with certain execution cases". Here also no details are given.

Now it has been pointed out by many hon'ble members from this side of the House every time and I find that the Finance Minister is noting down them. This Law Department is giving one of the worst type of administration in Assam. Because talented persons are not recruited for the purpose of conducting the cases in different courts in Assam on behalf of the Government. Govt. pleaders are recruited not on the basis of efficiency but on the basis of political affiliation. I have found in many courts that Government pleaders are taken on the basis of political affiliation and not on the basis of merit, who have no knowledge either in criminal laws or in civil laws. Because of this, Government have been defeated in almost all the cases and as a result the people have to pay a huge amount in the form of compensation. I suggested to gear up this branch of our administration so that they can maintain or conduct cases on behalf of the Government machinery efficiently. If you take the extent of expenditure incurred on this account during the last 5 years you will be surprised to see that in form of compensation, in the form of fees to lawyers conducting the Enquiry Commission etc 1/4 of

the State budget has been spent for this purpose. We repeatedly told the Government why cannot you make the Department efficient? Why best and efficient people are not recruited? But they have closed their eyes and shut their ears. In this way lakhs of rupees have been spent. We cannot vote for this amount, It is people's money, it is people's blood and at the same time spending the money you must be very careful that whether by spending this money any benefit will accrue to the people. In regard to item No. 10 and 11 it is a clear failure on the part of the Government and in particular on the part of the Law Department. The Law Department has always encouraged the policy of favouratism and nepotism. You will find Sir, in the Law Department, we have got Advocate General, Legal Remembrancer, Deputy Secretary, Under Secretary to represent the case. But we are to appoint other people to defend our case in the High Court and the Supreme Court for which we have to spend a huge amount.

This Department is expert in granting mercy to the scoundrels and anti-social elements. They are not doing justice to the people and for this I would say that the Law Department should be abolished forthwith. Because inspite of our repeated interests we found no improvement so far made and in every case which the Govt. took to the Supreme Court or to the High Court the Govt. lost. In any small case if the advice of the Law Department is sought they cannot give it nor they can guide us in any legal matter. Therefore, I would request that the Law Department should be made an effective department so that it can protect the

rights and privileges of the people in various fields of activities.

Now, coming to item No. 3. Allowances and honoraria. The additional amount of Rs. 2,000 is required to meet ad hoc Dearness Allowance sanctioned by Government Contract Allowance. The additional amount of Rs. 1,320 is required to meet the ad hoc Dearness Allowance and Rs. 7,180 for excess expenditure on account of high cost of maintenance of motor cars. This is most probably to meet the expenditure of the Governor. Then, Tour Expenses. The Additional Amount of Rs. 4620 is required to meet the ad hoc Dearness Allowance and excess expenditure of Rs. 7,380 on tour of the Governor. Then, Entertainment Expenses. The additional amount of Rs. 7,000 is required to meet the excess expenditure during the year on account of State Guests and parties, etc. This is when our people are starving parties and guests are maintained by the Governor. Then, Medical Facilities to the Governor, his family and staff. The additional amount of Rs. 5000 is required to meet increased expenditure on medical treatment of the Governor and staff and ad hoc Dearness Allowance of Rs. 440 for medical staff. Now, Sir, this is the picture depicted about the socialistic pattern of society or democratic socialism that has been followed by the party in power. We have mentioned it in this House earlier that this Governor is acting in a manner against the provision of the constitution and he is the man who is the master mind in dividing our brothers and sisters here in the Frontier State. When we are not in a position to give a piece of cloth to the poor

people, when we are not in a position to give a piece of bread to the down trodden people in the villages and to the flood affected people, the Governor is being given all sorts of facilities. Is it what the socialistic pattern of society the Government is coming forward to give us? The Government says there is no law and order situation in the Mizo Hills. The Government is very vocal in saying that they have done a lot for the Mizo brothers and sisters, But this will not satisfy them. Now, what the Governor is doing here? What for we are maintaining him with such huge expenditure if he does not look after the interests of the down trodden people who are groaning under poverty in villages? Is he here only for touring from Shillong to Kohima, Kohima to Shillong and then to Aizawl and then to Delhi and for his tours we are to spend so much of money? We are prepared to maintain more than one Governor provided our people can get bread and butter. When 13 lakhs of unemployed youths are wandering aimlessly throughout the State, when we are not in a position to give them any employment, when we are not in a position to get the poor people's property released for the education of their children, we have got no right to spend so much of money after the Governor and after the Ministers. And, I submit, Sir, if these things are allowed to continue, I am afraid that there is danger in Indian Democracy. You know Sir, an old man in death bed gives sermons to his children and grand children thought perhaps he was thoroughly a bad man in his time; a lamp gives more light just before it extinguishes itself - same is the case with the

Congress. By giving wrong slogans you may gain ground for the present but our people are intelligent and they will count inch by inch. If these things are allowed to continue in this way then I am afraid Democracy in India will be in danger. I may also submit to you, Sir, that the feelings expressed by our people in favour of Indira Gandhi is only a temporary thing; somebody may be jubilant about it but their jubilation will not last long and I would submit that the grants meant for the Governor is completely unreasonable and undemocratic and with these words I conclude my speech.

এইটোত ২১ হাজাৰ দিয়া হৈছিল এতিয়া আৰু ৫,৮০০ টকা দিয়া হৈছে ৩৪ হাজাৰ দিয়া হৈছিল; এতিয়া আৰু ৮৫০০ বঢ়াই দিয়া হৈছে। এজন ব্যক্তি আৰু তেখেতৰ যি সকল অফিচাৰ আছে সেই সকলৰ কাৰণেই ইমান টকা ব্যয় কৰা হৈছে। দেশৰ জনসাধাৰণৰ কল্যাণৰ কাৰণে প্ৰয়োজন হলে খৰছ বঢ়াব লাগে। তাত আমাৰ আপত্তি নাই। কিন্তু এজন মানুহৰ কাৰণে বঢ়োৱাত আমাৰ সম্পূৰ্ণ আপত্তি আছে। অহা ৩১ তাৰিখে সমগ্ৰ ভাৰততে লোক গননা হব। তাত ফুট পাথত পৰি থকা ভিক্ষাৰী, মগনীয়া, Stationত পৰি থকা সকলৰো হিচাপ কৰা হব। তেতিয়া অসমত বহুত লোক হিচাপত ওলাব। তেওঁলোকৰ কাৰণে আমি কিবা দিব পাৰিছোনে ? কিন্তু ৰাজ্যপালৰ কাৰণে অযথা অনেক টকা প্ৰত্যেক বছৰে বঢ়াবলগীয়া হৈছে।

Indian Oil refinery ৰ কাৰণে ৩, ২৪, ২৮৪ টকা দিয়া হৈছে। কিন্তু কাক দিয়া হৈছে এই কথা আমাক স্পষ্ট ভাবে জনোৱা হোৱা নাই। মই জনাত এই ৩, ২৪, ২৮৪ টকা দুজন মানুহৰ হাতলৈ গৈছে এজন হৈছে কেন্দ্ৰত থকা এজন অতি শক্তিশালী নেতা, এজন প্ৰকৃত সমাজবাদৰ প্ৰবৰ্ত্তক, আন জন হৈছে ফিচাৰীৰ ঋণ লোৱা কংগ্ৰেছী নেতা।

মই ভাবো ত্ৰিভূপাঠী দেৱে নিজেই কব যিহেতু তেখেতৰ কবলৈ সাহস আছে।

এজন হৈছে স্বনামধন্য নেতা ত্ৰিফখৰুদ্দিন আলি আহমদ আৰু আন জন হ'ল ত্ৰীদেবেন শৰ্মা। চিলিং আইন পাচ হোৱাৰ পাচতো চৰকাৰে তেখেতৰ অতিৰিক্ত মাটি খিনি লব নোৱাৰিলে তেখেতৰ মাটি খিনি চিলিং আইনৰ নীতি মতে যাব লাগিছিল; কিন্তু নগল। তেখেতে এনে ধৰণেৰে কাম কৰিলে যে চিলিং আইন মতে তেখেতৰ যিমান মাটি থাকিব লাগিছিল তাতোকৈ বেছিহে থাকিল। তাতোকৈ আচৰিত কথা যে চৰকাৰে যি খিনি মাটি ললে তাত থকা

লোক সকলে ২৫% কৈ ক্ষতিপূৰণ পাব লাগিছিল। এই খিনি টকা নিৰীহ গৰীব জনসাধাৰনে নাপালে।

কালি ৰাজ্যপালৰ ভাষণৰ ওপৰত বিতৰ্ক চলি থাকোতে আমাৰ মাননীয় সদস্য শ্ৰীনকুল দাস ডাঙৰীয়াই জগজীবন ৰাম আৰু শ্ৰীমতী ইন্দিৰা গান্ধীৰ নাম বাবে বাবে লৈছিল। মই তেতিয়া কৈছিলো যে তেখেত সকলৰ নাম ইমান বেছিকৈ নলব, বেছিকৈ ললে তেখেত সকল "চৰ্চনী খাই" মৰিব।

তাৰ পৰা মুক্ত হওক আৰু মুক্ত হবৰ কাৰণে আমাৰ অসমৰ দুখীয়া বাইজক কিছু আগবঢ়াই নিবৰ কাৰণে চেষ্টা কৰক। এই খিনিকে কৈ মোৰ বক্তব্যৰ সামৰনি মাৰিলোঁ।

অধ্যক্ষ মহোদয়, আপুনি শুনি আচৰিত হব যে যোৱা বছৰ আমাৰ বিধান সভাত মঞ্জুৰী নোলোৱাকৈয়ে E & D বিভাগত ৭ কোটি টকা উপৰৰি খৰছ কৰিছে আৰু তেনেকৈ P.W.D বিভাগতো কিমান কোটি টকা খৰছ কৰিছে, তাৰ কোনো হিচাব নাই। এইবিলাক খৰছ কৰোতে বিধান সভাৰ পৰা মঞ্জুৰী লোৱা নাছিল। খৰছ কৰাৰ পাছত এইটো কিয় আলোচনাৰ কাৰণে আনিছে? গতিকে মই কব বিচাৰিছোঁ যে এইদৰে আমাৰ বাজেটৰ টকাবোৰ যেনেকৈ খৰছ কৰিব লাগিছিল, তেনেকৈ খৰছ নকৰি ইয়াত বহুতো খুঁট থৈ দিছে আৰু পাছত বিধান সভাত আলোচনাৰ বাবে ইয়ালৈ আনিছে এইবোৰ প্ৰথমৰ পৰাই হৈ আহিছোঁ, কিন্তু এই বিলাক আঁতৰাবৰ কাৰণে বিত্তমন্ত্ৰী ডাঙৰীয়াই একো চেষ্টা কৰা নাই। ফলত আমাৰ খৰছ অত্যন্ত বেছি হৈ গৈছে; কিন্তু ইফালে কাম একোৱেই হোৱা নাই। অথচ প্ৰতি বছৰে ৪০/৫০ কোটি টকা ঘাটি পৰিয়েই আছে। এইবিলাক কিয় হবলৈ পাইছে? আমাৰ চৰকাৰৰ কোনো স্থিৰতা নাই কাৰণে সুচিন্তিত বা ঠিকমতে আঁচনি লব পৰা নাই। ফলত কোটি

শ্রীশৈলেন মেধি : এতিয়া consolidated fund ৰ পৰা যিখিনি টকা খৰচ কৰিলে সেইখিনি পোনপতীয়াকৈ নহলেও আওপাকে বুজিবলৈ নিদিয়াটো বৰ দুখৰ কথা। যিহেতু আমাৰ অৰ্থনৈতিক অৱস্থা সবল নহয়। গতিকে আৰ্থিক অৱস্থা টনকিয়াল কৰিবৰ বাবে আমি অৰ্থবিষয়ত শক্তিশালী নীতি গ্ৰহণ কৰিব লাগে।

Shri Hiralal Patwary : Sir, on a point of clarification. May I know from the Hon'ble Finance Minister whether the Choudhuries who were awarded the compensation in connection with acquisition of land for Oil Refinery at Gauhati are related to our Chief Minister ?

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi, : No.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, recently certain enhanced award amounting to Rs. 3,19,984 has to be paid in connection with three land acquisition cases for acquisition of land for Oil Refinery at Gauhati. Our information is that along with these an award has also been made to Shri F. A. Ahmed. We want to know whether it is a fact ?

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : It has not been covered that. When the question was - to whom the award was made, the reply was - it was Shri F.A Ahmed. But records show that it was not in any way related to Shri F.A. Ahmed.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, still it is not clear to us. We know very recently an award has been made to him. May be, this amount is shown to others name.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : We are just discussing this particular item. In this item no amount has been shown to as given to Shri F.A. Ahmed.

(Interruption)

Sir, the other questions raised were regarding the matter of court cases. Pursuit was not properly made by the department. There was some disagreement between the Department and the owner.

(Interruption)

The difficulty is that under the law of the land a man's property cannot be taken away without compensation.

Shri Lakshyadhar Choudhury : Sir, is there any time limit ?

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : No. This land in question.....

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : This land in question was taken over by the Govt. in the year 1957 for establishment of Oil Refinery. How is it that it could continue for over a decade ?

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : It is very clear under the law of limitation. Since the case has been running that period will not be counted. The other day I read a case which was started in the year 1905 during the British days and it continued till this year. So, the hon. members know that in this matter if a court case runs the limitation does not run and when the court case ends then the limitation starts, and thereafter from this point of view the question of compensation comes. Higher the property appreciates the higher compensation becomes necessary. There is a very valid point raised by the hon. members that the delay in assessment is one of the causes why higher compensation

later on is to be given. It is very correct. I entirely agree with the hon. members that the delay is one of the main causes for which the appreciation takes place. The hon. members and the Finance Minister are in one boat as against all the ministers in this regard (Laughter). So we are in the same boat. (After a pause)

So, I say in this matter so far as the compensation is concerned it is determined on the basis of market value and since the market value goes on appreciating then the compensation also goes on appreciating. Now, some people are very clever. Sometimes they speculate correctly and purchase 1, 2 or 3 khata of land in a particular place and whenever the Govt. wants to take over those lands they say that the cost of land in this particular area is very higher and so on and so forth.

This is what people generally do. Govt. is a hydra headed monster so also Mr. Patwary. (Laughter) And in the same way hon. members are also a part of the Govt. So, I say in this matter I appreciate the difficulty but the way out is not very easy. Because under the consitution of the land Govt.'s hands are tied.

The third point which was raised with regard to pursuit over a case in the court by the various Deptts. On this point a lot of discussion has taken place. A small committee has been set up by the hon. Chief Minister to take decision with regard to streamlining the legal arrangements of the Govt. I think the hon. Law Minister is the Secretary of that Committee and as soon as the report is available

we will take action to streamline the matter as quickly as possible.

Then a question was raised with regard to the Governor's establishment. But this matter could not engage all the hon. members because the amount allotted is very small, I find. Now, the point is the hon. members will say that difficulty arose because of the fact that D.A has been given to his staff in various ways. After all the Governor's establishment is the guest House of the Govt. of Assam, and therefore for this reason certain expenditure is to be incurred. Then comes the question of increase in medical facilities. This also not merely for the Governor but for his staff as well. I find Sir, this small amount should not qualify for a big discussion. A principal discussion does not arise in the supplementary demands. This will arise in the budget discussion. There was a time when the people thought that a Governor was redundant. But as in our democracy we have seen frequent fall of Govt. I mean in the absence of a regular Govt. the Governor is necessary. In some States we have seen it. So, at this stage a Governor seems to be very necessary. Now, as regards the Barowari Governor, a part of the expenditure is borne by Nagaland, NEFA. etc. If this is not done then the entire expenditure will have to be borne out of our coffer. I am not justifying, I am merely saying that the financial justification is there. There may be other justification also and if that is so then this financial justification will be the additional one. I am not saying that there should be a Barowari Governor for all the time. It has been done to keep a sort of unity in the eastern region of India.

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed : What is the amount received from Nagaland and N.E.F.A ?

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : This cannot be said often. So from the point as to whether there should be a Barowari Governor or whether there should be a Governor at all is a question to be discussed during the budget discussion.

Sir, there are certain mistakes pointed out by Mr. Patwary. I am thankful to him for that. The mistakes which have been pointed out are printing mistakes. Our printing arrangements are very inadequate and a lot of printing expansion is necessary immediately. Even the gazette cannot be published in time. If the expansion is possible then the mistakes will be reduced. With these words Sir, I command that the discussion may proceed on the supplementary grants.

Shri Abdul Motlib Mazumdar (Minister Law) :—Sir, I am extremely grateful to the hon. Members for pointing out some defects in the Law Department. Regarding Department-wise engagement of pleaders, it was done for convenience. There may be some lawyers who are experts in labour cases and some may be experts in industrial cases. Therefore for convenience sake this arrangement was made.

Regarding the other points, I am grateful to Shri Medhi for pointing out the two cases about which gossip is going on. He said "High Court সাজা দিলে. Govt. এৰি দিলে" As a matter of fact the Jurisdiction of the Government arises only after the court gives the verdict. (Shri Sailen Medhi : There is already a privilege motion on this). The Privilege

motion is not about these two cases. The Privilege motion has arisen out of my reply which was not considered suitable because in a hurry I could not couch the reply in proper language. As I was saying, Government's jurisdiction arises only after the court gives the verdict. A question has arisen whether the Government has any jurisdiction to deal with these two cases.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— The entire matter is under the consideration of the privileges committee.

Shri Sailen Medhi :— The hon. Speaker must clarify whether the whole matter is under the consideration of the Privileges Committee or only a part of the matter is under consideration.

Mr. Speaker :— Nothing is to be said about a matter which is under the consideration of the Privileges Committee.

Shri Abdul Motlib Mazumdar :— I beg to submit that the privilege motion was with regard to my answer on the question put by Mr. Kalita. I tried to reply in a hurry when the facts were not with me.

Mr. Speaker : You can give your explanation to the Privileges Committee.

Shri Abdul Matlib Mazumdar : Sir, mention has been made about the two cases. I beg to submit that it was quite legally done and the Government has full competence to exercise its powers.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, according to May's Parliamentary Practice when a matter is sub-judice or under the consideration of Privilege Committee or any other Com-

mittee, it should not be discussed unless the report is placed before the House for consideration.

Shri Sainen Medhi : I have already mentioned that certain facts were discussed in this House and I have also said that the entire matter is under consideration of the Privilege Committee. Some persons alleged to be food adulterators were released by the Minister for which he is facing privilege motion.

Shri Abdul Matlib Mazumdar : He said “হাই কোর্টে সাজা দিলে, গভর্নমেন্টে এরি দিলে।” Government has full authority to do so.

Shri Sainen Medhi : I only stated the facts but the Minister is going to justify it.

Shri Abdul Motlib Mazumdar : That was done legally.

Mr. Speaker : I have already stated that the matter which has been referred to the Privilege Committee should not be discussed here by either side.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : (Minister Finance) I beg to move demand No.1.

Mr. Speaker : Motion moved.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : On a point of order, Sir. You will remember that during the last year when the list of supplementary demands for grants and supplementary appropriation for 1970-71 were moved, a point of order was raised from this side of the House about item No. 25,

and it was ruled out by the Deputy Speaker in your absence that this amount cannot be voted on a technical ground. This time also the same point has arisen.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : That point will arise afterwards when demand No. 36 will come.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Unless that point is decided, we are not going to discuss any demand. Every time you take that plea that it can be discussed when the appropriate demand is moved. But afterwards when there will be no time all the grants will be guillotined we will not get any chance to speak. Therefore, this point must be discussed and settled now before we proceed to discuss the grants. Here item No. 36 of the list of supplementary demand relates to road and water transport schemes and it will be found in pages 64, 65, 66 and 67. Sir, in this respect our Budget Manual which has been framed by the Govt. is very clear. It says - "Subject to the provisions of Articles 205 and 206, no money shall be withdrawn from the Consolidated Fund of the State except under appropriation made by law passed in accordance with the provisions of this article."

"205. Supplementary, additional or excess grants. —

- (1) The Governor shall —
 - (a) if the amount authorised by any law made in accordance with the provisions of Article 204 to be expended for a particular service for the current financial year is found to be insufficient for the purposes of that year or when a need has arisen during the current financial year for supplementary or additional expenditure upon some new service

not contemplated in the annual financial statement for that year....." Therefore, when there is insufficiency of fund then only the question of supplementary demand will come. Sir, you will remember that during the last Budget Session the demand No.60 under head "road transport scheme" at page 400, volume II of the Budget was withdrawn. When the amount has been.....

When the amount has been withdrawn and when a token provision has not been taken there can not be any supplementary grant on that head. On that line the Deputy Speaker who was in the Chair gave a ruling, and on the basis of that ruling last time this amount was withdrawn.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : Which item are we discussing demand No. 1 or demand No. 36 ?

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : I am challenging the entire list of Supplementary demands. Unless it is decided as to whether this particular item No. 36 can be included in the supplementary list of demands, no further discussion can be held.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : Now can that be ?

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Last time we did not do this. The Deputy Speaker was kind enough to give the ruling on the subject first and then we took the discussion of other demands. Repeatedly we have been saying that this is an illegal process adopted by the Government to take vote on this grant by violating the rules of the budget manual and the provisions of the constitution. Unless a decision is taken on this issue, I think, the House cannot proceed with the discussion of other items.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : So far as I find the grants are absolutely independent and separate. Each grant is separately voted in this House. It can be voted or withdrawn. Sir, you requested me to move grant No. 1 and I moved it. I was thinking that discussion was taking place on grant No. 1. The Hon'ble Member has raised an issue as to whether grant No. 36 could be discussed now. We are not discussing grant No. 36. When grant No. 36 comes up that objection can be taken up by the Hon'ble Member - we have no objection.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : If you, Sir, go through the ruling of the Deputy Speaker given on the last occasion on our objection on the same subject, you will find that our stand is correct.

Mr. Speaker : I cannot accept the contention put forward by Shri Barua. The grants are separate. There may be many other defects in many other grants. That will be decided when the particular grants are taken up. Because that one grant is defective and for that other grants cannot be taken up cannot be the ruling. I, therefore, rule out the objection raised by Shri Barua. We may take up Grant No. 1.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : We are to abide by your decision ; but I want to point out, Sir, that there is a ruling in this House. I want to have a clarification. Suppose grant No. 1 is taken up now, and by the time the discussion is concluded the time is up. What will then happen. Along with others this alleged illegal grant will also be guillotined.

Shri Phani Bora : Sir, you have ruled that this supplementary demands should be taken up one by one as usual. Now, Mr. Barua's point is that it is not constitutional to place grant No. 36 at all in the list of supplementary demands. According to him it has violated the provisions of the constitution, the rules and the Budget Manual. Now you are to clarify this point - whether it violates the provisions or not. If your decision is that it does violate the rules, and if items are taken up serially one after another, what will happen to this illegal item item No. 36 if for want of time it has to be guillotined along with some others. On this point Shri Barua wants clarification. I am also not clear whether this objection is valid or not.

Mr. Speaker : If by the time discussion on grant No. 36 is over, the whole thing will go - according to rules all the items will be guillotined.

Shri Phani Bora : What is the opinion of the Chair regarding the objection raised by Shai Barua about grant No. 36 ?

Mr. Speaker : About Grant No. 36, I have already stated. There are many demands which remain to be discussed and if we take up 36 now, all will be guillotined.

Shri Phani Bora : Sir, my friend Shri Barua challenges against the Constitutional provision. His contention is that this demand is against all financial rules and that is why it is illegal and it should not be considered along with other items, and you are to give your ruling on that point only not on the merits or demerits of the demand, but only on the legality of the demand.

Mr. Speaker : Unless it is discussed one cannot say that it is illegal. According to Shri Barua it is illegal. Therefore now the question is at what stage it should be discussed.

Shri Phani Bora : Shri Barua says it is illegal because it does not come under the purview of any financial rule or Constitutional provision. Sir, you are to give your ruling on the legality of the Demand. You cannot take away our right by means of force.

Mr. Speaker : Sri Tripathy, do you have anything to say ?

Shri Biswadev Sarma, (Minister, Industries) : Sir, I want a little bit of clarification. The Demand No. 36 is said to be illegal. Now which Article of the Constitution it has offended and which are the financial rules it has offended. That must be pointed out. It does not hold good by simply saying that it is illegal.

Mr. Speaker : He has referred to the Budget Manual.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, I have pointed out the provision of the Constitution and the Budget Manual and on this when a similar Demand came up during the last Session, the Deputy Speaker ruled it a out of order. I am fully convinced that all the other items will come one by one and Item 36 can never come up, but at the time of guillotine when you keep this item pending for other day or you want to steamroller over it, then it will be illegal.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : Sri, I think we should proceed as usual one by one and then if the hon. Members are willing to discuss item 36, we should stop after passing Item 35 and discuss Item 36. I suggest let us go on discus-

sing other Demand and when we come to Item 36, we will discuss it and it will be clear whether it is Constitutional or valid.

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed : There is no question of suggestion. Here is a point of order and it is upto the Speaker to give his ruling.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : The Speaker has already given his ruling.

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed : We want a ruling from the Chair about the legality of the Demand.

Shri Phani Bora : Sir, you gave your ruling on the procedure whether we should discuss from the first to the end or as usual, but you have not given your ruling with regard to the objections raised about illegality of the Demand No. 36.

Shri Biswadev Sarma : Sir, according to the procedure, let us go ahead, and in the meantime let us get hold of the past ruling.

Shri Phani Bora : There should not be any application of tricks.

Shri Biswadev Sarma : Sir, he should not use that word.

Shri Phani Bora : Here a very important point is raised. Whether it is legal or illegal. I remember that during the last Budget session similar demand was put forward and there was a long debate, and ultimately there was a ruling from the Deputy Speaker that the item be withdrawn. The item was then withdrawn and there was no discussion on it. In the same character, this Demand has come. Sir, first the point of order should be resolved and then we should proceed.

Shri Prabin Kumar Choudhury (Minister, Transport) : Mr. Speaker, Sir, there was no ruling given by the Deputy Speaker. I withdrew that Demand last session. After that I discussed with the Financial Experts. They said that this amount has been spent in 1969-70 from the Contingency and it was brought before the House only to regularise.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, the Financial Rules are very clear. This could have been regularised if a token demand would have brought before the House. I do not know who are these financial experts. The financial experts are always exploiters. There is only one alternative with regard to this. This should be processed through the Public Accounts Committee. It should be in the form of excess grants, it cannot come as Supplementary Demand. We have at least gained certain experience about financial matter by our association with the Public Accounts Committee.

তেখেতে যিটো কথা কৈছে সেইমতে Back door policy হয়

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy : Excess Grantত যিটো কথা কৈছে সেইবিলাক ইয়াত Applicable নহব— ।

Sir, excess grants mean the money which was provided in the budget, but spent through oversight and discovered later on. Then it is passed by way of excess grants.

Therefore, the idea that the excess grant will cover this is not correct indeed supposing Government has incurred expenditure which was not provided in the budget. Now, question is whether this House, the Ministry can bring it ? This question is very clear that this House is the only body which can regularise (voices) just as the House has the right to regularise the expenditure which has already

been incurred. There is no doubt that it was a regular expenditure. If you say the expenditure is irregular, this House is the only body which can regularise irregular things, even by constitutional means this should be passed because this will take the whole day and the hon Members will lose time.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— This grant was withdrawn. It was put in the Supplementary grant, that was also withdrawn.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy :— After discussing with the financial experts we found that this can be moved and therefore we have moved in pursuance of the examination of the whole case by financial experts.

Mr. Speaker :— The Deputy Speaker gave a ruling,

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy :— Let us go ahead with the discussion because time will be lost. But so far as this grant is concerned, this cannot be moved — this can come only through Supplementary demand which cannot be postponed. Either it is to be rejected or passed as you like. Let us discuss the matter.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— If the House is empowered to do illegal things and if we abide by the rules framed by the financial experts, more so, by the Constitution. We cannot amend the Constitution. If you want to amend the Constitution we welcome it.

Finance Minister is driving us to do some illegal things, which we cannot. This House has rejected it in the same form. Therefore, the question is that, as he has said, the House has got power to do things like this, the House has the power to fix some other day.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy :— This cannot be done.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— Then 36 cannot be withdrawn. The House can fix some other day.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy :— The demands are fixed against the guillotine and the expenditure must start in point of time and will have to be incurred before 31st March. So this money has to be spent (voices). So far as this grant is concerned, there is time limit as the expenditure was incurred against guillotin and therefore we can proceed on. You are already foregoing.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :—Let us fix up some other day for the discussion or let us discuss other items. This time is to be deferred. (Voices) I know his tactics (Finance Minister). His tactics is this bill will have to be passed. They cannot do this. Allow us to discuss on this technical issue today; otherwise we are not going to agree to the proposal of the Government.

Mr Speaker :— Whether Grant No. 36 can be postponed.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy :— The House has the right to throw out the demand.

Mr Speaker :— As regards Grant No. 36 there was ruling. I want to see the ruling what sort of ruling that was. I understand that was withdrawn (voices). This cannot be kept postponed.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— If this is postponed we can put the Appropriate Bill. (Voices) then Appropriation will have to be postponed this should be taken up on some other day.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathy:—Hon Members know that the time is extremely short and the expenditures have to be incurred. Why are we passing this Supplementary Demand today only, the 16th day of March '71. If we do not pass this Demand no expenditure can be undertaken or the whole budget will be infractious and that will be the result of postponement. (Voices—Finance Minister is taking advantage) I am not taking advantage, rather the Hon'ble members are taking advantage of a mistake that was committed in the past through over-sight. Salaries will have to be paid to the Govt. Servants. The mistake was committed by the Chief Minister through oversight and that was also a technical mistake. Now, for this technical mistake forgo the Budget provision of Rs 14 crores. It was absolutely a technical mistake.

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed: Sir, on this point of order there is another point of order. Hon'ble member Shri Barua raised a point of order. Under rule 34 there shall not be debate on the point of order. You have given your ruling on this point of order that the demand should be postponed, and after the ruling has been given no debate shall be there.

Shri Premadhor Bora : বিত্ত মন্ত্রীর কথা হুজুরকে বলছি দিব পারেন :

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi: Who has given the ruling? (Voice from the Opposition : the Speaker has given it.) Then I agree with the hon'ble members that the Speaker has given the ruling that there shall not be any discussion and to proceed with other grants.

Mr. Speaker: I think, we should postpone 36.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : How can you postpone it ? In that case no expenditure can be undertaken ; the whole budget of 14 crores will go. (voice from the Opposition : The Speaker has given ruling to postpone item No. 36) How can the Finance Minister say that the Speaker cannot postpone it ?) The Speaker kindly enquired of the Finance Minister whether it could be postponed. This is a query (interruptions)

Mr. Speaker : I only wanted to ascertain whether this could be postponed. He expressed his difficulty. (Voice from Treasury Bench : The House can do it.)

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed : You have given the ruling that it should be postponed.

Mr. Speaker : I wanted to ascertain what would be legal difficulty and whether it could be postponed or not. That is not my ruling.

Shri Biswadev Sarma : What about the previous ruling regarding the procedure ? You have said that we can proceed with other grants.

Shri Phani Bora : আপুনি কৈছিল যে এইটো postpone ৰাখি বাকীখিনিৰ কাম proceed কৰিব পাৰে, অসুবিধা একো নাই। তেখেতে কৈছে আজি Appropriation Bill খন পাচ নহব। এইখন পাচ নহলে পৃথিবীখন তললৈ নাযায় ; সেই কাৰণে কালিলৈ Appropriation Bill খন ললেও হব। এতিয়া সেই লিষ্টমতে proceed কৰক। till you are prepared to give the ruling on the point of order, in the meantime keep that number 36 aside and proceed with number 1.

Shri Atul Chandra Goswami : সংবিধান ভঙ্গ কৰি আমি একো কৰিব নোৱাৰো। উপাধ্যক্ষই দিয়া কলিংটো পঢ়ি দিয়ক।

Shri Kamini Saran Sarma : সংবিধান মঞ্চকৰি কৰিব যাওঁতে মহা অস্থায় হব।

Mr. Speaker : What are the points raised in the point of order.....

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : He has raised only that until 36 is clear the whole thing should not be discussed.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : I have only raised the Constitutional views and rules and regulations of the Government and the rules and regulations followed by this House. According to the rules and regulations of the House as well as according to the Constitutional provisions it does not permit to include that item in the supplementary demand. If you go through the rules it will be crystal clear.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : I have already submitted on the basic issue. Here is an amount which was incurred for salaries of past year. Now naturally, that is said not to have been included in the budget and the arguments are that the item which was not included in the budget cannot be put in the supplementary demand. Now this idea that this should be brought by way of excess demand later on through the Public Accounts Committee when the expenditure will be passed as excess expenditure. I humbly beg to say that the argument is not correct because.....

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : They have discussed the experts. We have also discussed with our experts (interruptions)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : I ask for the ruling of the Speaker. When he speaks I have to yield and when I am making my reply he is again making submission. He

cannot make any submission at this point (Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : on a personal explanation) There is no question of any personal explanation. You will do it afterwards. So the suggestion was that it should be passed by way of excess expenditure. Now the excess theory does not apply. Because the expenditure which was made by the Department was not included in the budget. Now this is a question of expenditure and this House is pre-eminently capable of regularising the expenditure (voice from the Opposition : under what rule ?) and therefore, we have brought it by way of supplementary demand. There are only two ways : whether it can be passed by way of demand in the Budget session and whether it can be brought by way of Supplementary demand. Therefore, this is the demand. No rule or Constitutional provision contravene.

Shri Lakshyadhar Chaudhury :—Mr. Speaker, Sir, without original Grant there cannot be a Supplementary Demand.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua :— Sir, as the Minister of Transport has said that he has consulted a financial expert (we know much about the Assam financial experts who only misguide the Government and the House) I have also discussed the matter with a top-most financial expert of the Government of India before I came to discuss this point here. He said that it can come only through one way and that is through the Public Accounts Committee. Because, there is no original Grant. This is not my suggestion it is the opinion of an expert. (Shri K. P. Tripathi, Minister—That expert is wrong) Your expert has shown this picture. (Shri K. P. Tripathi, Minister—Then both are

wrong). Sir, the Finance Minister has not pointed out under what rule the House has got the authority to pass this Grant. We have pointed out the Constitutional rules and the rules framed by themselves. Now, we cannot amend the Constitution or amend the rules here today. Therefore, this is an illegal thing he is going to press us to do and we are not going to do it.

Shri Sainen Medhi :—Sir, the Finance Minister has said that this is neither an excess demand nor a Supplementary demand. It is a demand which we can pass in the House. He has not shown any procedure or rules under which we can pass a demand which is neither an excess demand nor a Supplementary demand. There was lot of argument on that point and as a result of which the Hon'ble Transport Minister had to withdraw that demand. Now, he has again come up and said that according to expert opinion we can pass this demand. But under what rule? Shri Dulal Barua has said that if you want to pass this demand you come up through the Public Accounts Committee and as an Excess Demand you can pass it. Then the Finance Minister said that it is not an excess demand because there was no original demand. He also said that this is neither a Supplementary Demand as there was no original demand. So, what demand it is? Under what provision the Finance Minister has come up to move it in this House? Unless these are clarified we are afraid we cannot pass this demand which neither an excess demand nor a Supplementary demand.

Shri Atul Chandra Goswami :—যোৰা বাজেট অধিবেশনটো এই বিষয়টোৰ ওপৰত যথেষ্ট বিতৰ্ক হৈছিল আৰু ইয়াৰ ওপৰত মাননীয় উপাধ্যক্ষ

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi :—Sir, this is absolutely a technical point which has been raised. It has no material validity. This expenditure refers to the salary of employees of the department for the month of March. Now, up to the 31st March they were the employees of the Govt. of Assam and everybody will admit that their salary was due. But salary for the month of March is paid in April. Therefore, actual expenditure is incurred in April. That was the position. Since budget provision was not made for 1970-71. This was past service rendered by the employees. Can this Government say that for the past service rendered they should not be paid? Therefore, it is absolutely a technical point. The only point is whether it can be regularised. Therefore, I make the submission that when the House knows that salaries which are for the services already rendered and are a legitimate expenditure of the State, this House has the right to regularise it.

(Voice - By what rule ?)

This is an extraordinary case which the House is required to vote.

Mr. Speaker : It was discussed threadbare during the previous session. Hon. Deputy Speaker held that the demand is anomalous. The Finance Minister also after a good deal of discussion agreed that the demand was of the nature of a demand as the amount was already expended by drawing from the contingency fund. There is an altogether a diff-

erent procedure for bringing excess demands. It was held that the demand was out of order and it could not be placed to vote of the House in the present form (Thumping on the benches by the Opposition)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : The ruling of the Deputy Speaker is wrong.

(Uproar)

(Voices — He should withdraw it - it is a case of breach of privilege)

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, the hon. Finance Minister, being a senior Member of the House has cast aspersion on the Chair. Therefore, the hon. Minister must withdraw what he said.

(Interruption)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : Sir, I was not casting aspersion on the Chair. Hon. Deputy Speaker has said that the money could be drawn by way of excess demands. We from our side cannot take the amount as an excess demand. We have some difficulty.....

(Uproar)

(Voice — He must withdraw his words)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : All right, I withdraw my words.

(Interruption)

Mr. Speaker : Order ! Order ! Please. The Minister, Finance has withdrawn his words. Please be quiet.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : Sir, I cannot understand why the hon. Finance Minister, being a senior Member of

the Cabinet can say that it is an excess demand, it is exactly a new service not contemplated in the budget.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi: The point is that if there is provision.....

(Interruption)

Shri Giasuddin Ahmed: Mr. Speaker, Sir, hon. Finance Minister should not be allowed to argue further on the point.

(Voice — Noboy can argue against the Chair)

(Several hon. Members were on their feet)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi: The point is that if there is a provision in the budget, then it becomes necessary to place it to the vote of the House.

(Interruption)

Shri Sailen Medhi: Sir, the hon. Finance Minister is not correct. (Interruption) As there was no original demand, there cannot be excess demand. It cannot be placed to vote of the House in its present form. If there is an original demand, then they can bring this as an excess demand. Sir, on one hand the Minister has said that it was an excess demand and on the other hand he tried to show that it was a new demand. Actually, it was a demand which has been brought without the original financial statement.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi: Sir, generally expenditure on salaries of the office staff for the month of March is incurred in the month of April. But due to some difficulty in bringing the demand in time (Interruption)

Mr. Speaker:— As it was already decided by the Hon' Deputy Speaker on the last occasion, it cannot be placed to the vote of the House in the present form.

(Cheers from the Opposition)

The hon' Finance Minister has said that there was some difficulty in bringing the demand in the form of excess demand . But his difficulty will not rectify the mistake already done . As the Deputy Speaker held that it was a mistake , how the Minister can bring this demand before the House to vote in the present form ? As regards constitutional competence, the House can condone the irregularity if it chooses to do so . But when there is objection from the Opposition Parties on the ground that it was rejected by the chair on the last occasion, therefore, you cannot bring this demand in its present form .

(Cheers from Opposition)

(Thumping on the benches)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi :— Sir, if there is any expenditure which was incurred and which was justifiable, therefore the House has the right.

Therefore, I say that the House should exercise its power to regularise the irregularity, when it finds that it was justifiably incurred. I am urging upon the Speaker that the House has inherent right to regularise the irregularity if the expenditure is justifiably incurred.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : In addition to that my submission is that the Finance Minister has committed a mistake. He could not understand the thing. The hon. Deputy Speaker was very clear about it because this expenditure which was incurred by the Govt. was above the expenditure on the original budget of the year 1970 and it has been converted into a Corporation on the 1st of

April, 1970. Therefore, the question of expenditure which was allotted in the earlier budget and which could not be met should not come in the form of demand. Sir, it will cast a reflection to the Chair that the Deputy Speaker is wrong. The observation of the Deputy Speaker is perfectly correct and he was kind enough to give his ruling in this regard.

Mr. Speaker : About this demand I hold and also I agree with the Deputy Speaker that the demand is out of order.

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : I beg to move demand No. 1.

Mr. Speaker : I put the out motion to vote. The question is that the total provision of Rs. 7,873, under Supplementary Demand No. 1. Major head "4. — Taxes on Income other than Corporation Tax" at page 1 of the list of Supplementary Demands be reduced to Re. 1, i.e., the amount of the whole supplementary demand of Rs. 7,873 do stand reduced to Re. 1.

(The cut motion was lost by voice vote)

Now, I put the demand. The question is that an additional amount of Rs. 7,873 be granted to the Minister-in-charge to defray certain charges which will come in the course of payment during the year ending the 31st March, 1971 for the administration of the Head "4. — Taxes on income other than Corporation Tax."

(The demand was passed)

Shri Prabin Kumar Choudhury : I beg to move demand No. 2.

((ut motion not moved)

Mr. Speaker : I put the question. The question is that Demand No. 2 be passed.

(The demand was passed)

Shri Kamakhya Prasad Tripathi : I move demand No. 3.

Shri Dulal Chandra Barua : I move my cut motion that the total provision of Rs. 2,95,089 under Supplementary Demand No. 3 Major head "12 — Sales Tax and 13, — Other Taxes and Duties" at page 3 of the List of Supplementary Demands be reduced to Re. 1, i.e., the amount of the whole supplementary demand of Rs. 2,95,089 do stand reduced to Re. 1.

While moving my cut motion under this head I want to make certain observations. Sir, it has been observed that the major amount has been or going to be spent under this head for shifting of offices. As you know, Sir, there has been constant demand from this side of the House as well as from the public for the shifting of capital from here to a centrally located place in the plains. But the Government

suddenly took a decision to shift some of the offices from here to Gauhati where there is no accommodation for the office as well as for the staff. For example, Government suddenly took a decision to shift the office of the Flood Control and Irrigation to Gauhati and you will be surprised to see the pitiable condition of the employees there. Some of the employees had to spend their days on the street in the absence of accommodation either in hotels or elsewhere. And those who have families are experiencing great difficulties because they cannot get rented accommodation at Gauhati. Therefore, we are demanding constantly for the shifting of the capital and Government also in principle agreed to shift the capital. But we do not know why there is so much delay in implementing the decision. On the other hand they are taking piece-meal decision to shift the offices and thereby creating inconvenience to the staff. It is now very difficult to locate the offices which have been shifted and even if one can find the locatinon, it is difficult to find the officers or staff there and the efficiency of the administration has deteriorated very considerably, and the people are suffering.

Therefore Sir, at the time of moving this Cut Motion I must reiterate our demand that Government should take a final decision for building up a new capital somewhere in a centrally located place and not to take a piecemeal policy and to cause inconvenience to the public in general. As regards selection of site for shifting the capital Government have formed two committees Technical Committee and Cabinet Sub-committee. Before giving final decision to

the shifting of capital we hope and believe that Government will take this side of the House also into confidence. Shri Medhi has already observed that though there is increase in the number of staff in the tax-collecting Machinery, there has been no appreciable change in recovery of arrear rents. This aspect of the matter should be carefully looked into by the Government so that there is efficiency in the tax-collecting machinery. As regards the arrear, I have no time to give the figures, but it is a huge amount. We have got no objection for spending money under this particular head if it can improve collection of revenue for the exchequer. Government is generally expert in realising arrears from the common man by even taking coercive methods. But you will see that huge amounts are still to be realised from big firms. I hope Govt. will be up and doing in realising arrear taxes. With these observations I move my motion.

অসমৰ মানুহৰ যিখিনি ক্ষমতা আছে সেই ক্ষমতাৰ দ্বাৰা এই ৰাজধানী খন সুসজ্জিত ভাবে পতা উচিত হব। সেই ফালৰ পৰা গুৱাহাটী যিখন টাউন সি কোনো ৰকমে উপযুক্ত নহয়। তেনে অবস্থাতো আজি অফিছ বিলাক পৰিকল্পনাহীনভাৱে চান্দমাৰী, বামুনিমৈদাম আদি ঠাইত পতটোত মই দুখোৰ প্ৰতিবাদ কৰো। কিন্তু আটায়ে বহি আমি য'ত ৰাজধানীৰ ঠাই Select কৰিম। তালৈ যদি ২।১ কৈ অফিছ নি থাকে তাত কাৰো একো কব লগীয়া নাই।

An additional amount of Rs. 2,95,085 is required for the following purpose :—

1. An amount of Rs. 55,850 is required under pay of officers under "Direction" as one Additional post of Assistant Commissioner of Taxes

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and five Superintendents of Taxes have been created during the current year for which no estimate was made in the Budget.

2. An amount of Rs. 15,283 is required under pay of Establishment under direction as a number of vacant posts have been filled up during the year and also some new posts have been created and filled up.

3. An amount of Rs. 23,143 is required under allowance and Honorary under Direction (against only Rs. 11,000 sanctioned by Government vide FTX 42/70/34, dated 9th April 1970) for meeting the expenditure on Transfer Travelling Allowance of the establishment and officers consequent on the shifting of the Head Quarter from Shillong to Gauhati. As the number of Touring Officers has increased, expenditure of Travelling Allowance for officers has also increased in spite of observance of all possible economy. Besides, increase number of posts of Officers and Assistants and Grade IV staff has resulted in excess expenditure on the Dearness Allowance. The total amount of increase under the above heads has been reduced to some extent by savings on account of winter allowances consequent to the shifting of the office to Gauhati.

4. An amount of Rs. 1,16,664 is required under Contingencies under Direction. Against this amount Rs. 50,000 was sanctioned by Government vide FTX. 42/70/36, dated 9th April 1970 for purchasing furnitures etc, consequent to the shifting of the Head Quarters to Gauhati and Rs. 6,000 vide FTX. 42/70/35, dated 9th April 1970 to meet the expenditure in shifting of Records to Gauhati. Government have also sanctioned 8 phones vide No. GPT—23/61/57, dated 28th April 1970 of which 3 phones have already been installed under OYT Scheme at the cost of Rs. 7,700 and a proposal is pending with Government for installation of a PABX with 20 lines which will cost about Rs. 9,000 this year. Another sum of Rs. 9,000 will be required to meet the expenditure for purchase of 2 Type-writers and 3 Calculating machines already sanctioned by Government. Also Rs. 36,000 will also be required to pay the House rent for the hired building at Gauhati which was not included in the Budget.

5. An amount of Rs. 19,897 will be required under Allowance and Honoraria under Superintendence to meet the D. A. of staff and their medical reimbursement bills which were estimated less in the Budget.

An amount of Rs. 38,509 is required under contingencies under "Superintendence" to meet the expenditure for supply of additional furniture, some Type-writers, fans, etc. and to meet expenditure in respect of day to day running of the Unit and Zonal offices.

6. An amount of Rs. 5,343 is required under pay of Officers of Sixth Schedules Area (Shillong Unit Office) to pay arrear amounts to Officers of that Office.

7. An amount of Rs. 10,670 is required under Allowance and Honoraria of Sixth Schedules areas on account of submitting less estimate of D. A. for the staff.

8. An amount of Rs. 9,780 is required under Contingencies of Sixth Schedules areas mainly for meeting the expenditure on House rent which was not estimated in the current year's budget at the time of preparation of which the office of the Superintendent of Taxes, Shillong was accommodated in a Government building at Shillong.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

In view of the dissolution of the Parliament on the 27th December, 1970, the Election Commission of India decided that the 5th General Election to Lok Sabha should be completed by early March, 1971. Such a contingency could not be anticipated at the time of preparation of the Budget for current year and also the provision made in the current year for preparation for the next General Election, 1972 by Supplementary Demand of Rs. 1,25,000 in the last session of the Assembly over the original grant of Rs. 8,000 is far short of the actual requirement demanded for meeting the expenditure involved in connection with the 5th General Election to Lok Sabha, 1971. The amount of Rs. 6,91,983 has to be obtained from the Contingency fund in this connection which require to be regularised by Supplementary Demand.

The entire expenditure involve in connection with the fifth General Election to Lok Sabha will be born exclusively by the Government of India, initial expenditure being made from the consolidated fund of the State Government.

1. *Pay of Ministers*— The additional amount is required due to the appointment of 6 more new Ministers, Ministers of State and Deputy Ministers, etc., for which there is no provision in the budget for 1970-71.

4. *Allowance and Honoraria*—

(a) *Dearness allowance*— The additional amount is required due to the grant of *ad-hoc* dearness allowance at Rs. 20 p. m. by the Government to all the employees drawing pay upto Rs. 749 with effect from 1st September 1969 for which there is no provision in the budget for 1970-71.

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(b) *Winter allowance*— This small amount is required due to the entertainment of some posts of Grade IV Government servants. These posts had to be created due to the appointment of 6 more Ministers, etc., as already explained in para I above.

(b) *Telephone charges*—The additional amount required under the Sub-head is due to the installation of many new telephones in the offices and residences of the newly appointed Ministers, etc., and also in the residences of their Private Secretary's. The excess expenditure under the Sub-head is also due to increased number of trunk calls for various administrative reasons and also mainly due to the payment of old outstanding telephone bills.

(c) *Purchase of Motor Cars*—The additional amount of Rs. 1,60,062 is required to regularise the advance taken from the Contingency Fund. Due to the appointment of 6 new Ministers, Ministers of State, etc., some new Cars had to be purchased and allotted to them for which there was no provision in the budget for 1970-71.

3. *Allowance and Honoraria*—(a)—*Dearness allowance*—The additional amount is required due to the grant of *Ad-hoc* Dearness allowance at Rs.20 p.m. by the Government to all the employees drawing pay upto Rs. 749 with effect from 1st September, 1969 for which there was no provision in the budget for 1970-71 ...

4. *Contingencies*—(a)—*Contract Contingencies*— The excess is mainly due to the rise in prices of furniture, stationery and other articles and also more expenses on postage stamps and telegram charges for administrative reasons and hence the additional amount is required.

(b) *Non-Contract Contingencies*,— The expenditure under the subhead is mainly due to the heavy expenditure for the Telephone charges. B.—District Jails—General—Allowances.—The original provision of Rs. 3,40,000 fell short of requirement due to payment of arrear Dearness Allowance of the Warders staff, Dearness Allowance kept under Special deposit. Transfer Travelling Allowance of Jailors Assistant Jailors, Warders, etc. Hence further additional grant of Rs. 1,80,000 is necessary.

Contingencies.—Due to continued over population in all the Jails of Plains areas the original provision fell short of requirement. As against registered accommodation 5,384 Prisoners the average daily prison population varied between 7,000 to 7,900. Hence an additional requirement of Rs. 2,37,000 is necessary to meet the expenditure on maintenance of Prisoners.

B.— District Jails—Sixth Schedules Areas—Contingencies.— Due to continued over population in the Jails of Sixth Schedule Areas of the State the original provision of Rs. 2,59,700 has fallen short of the requirement, as against the registered accommodation of 186 prisoners the average daily population in the Jails varied between 530 to 570. Hence additional fund of Rs. 67,500 is necessary to meet the cost of maintenance of the Prisoners.

C.—Charges for police Custody—Sixth Schedule Areas.—The original provision of Rs. 76,065 will fall short of requirement in connection with the maintenance of Lockup of Mikir Hills, North Cachar Hills and Mizo Hills in view of increase in the number of undertrial Prisoners in the Lockup. Hence an additional fund of Rs. 2,625 is necessary.

Expenditure in connection with Mizo Hills Disturbance—General.—The original fund of Rs. 50,000 provided for maintenance of Prisoners relating to Mizo Hills disturbance in the plains areas Jails have fallen short of requirement as the number of such prisoners in the different Jails varied between 170 to 200. Hence an additional fund of Rs. 3,750 is necessary to meet the cost of maintenance.

Expenditures in connection with Mizo Hills Disturbance—Sixth Schedule Areas.—For meeting the cost of maintenance of prisoners in the Additional Jail at Aijal opened recently a sum of Rs. 18,000 will be necessary. The Jail started functioning from January, 1971.

F.—Agricultural Colony.—Average daily population in the Agricultural Colony at Jorhat is 50 prisoners and the arrear pay of Superintendent of the Colony amounted to Rs. 9,000 as such the original provision of Rs. 36,450 has fallen short of requirement by Rs. 25,000. To meet this requirement an additional amount of Rs. 25,000 is necessary.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

At the time of presenting the Budget for 1970-71, it was anticipated that all the Employment Information and Assistance Bureau and Employment Market Information units in Khasi and Jaintia and Garo Hills under the Directorate of Employment and Craftsmen Training, Assam would be under the jurisdiction of the Government of Meghalaya and hence no provision was made in the State Budget for the aforesaid establishments. [1] and [2].—The provision under Maintenance and Repairs is inadequate compared to the volume of works involved in the maintenance of the Flood Control Schemes.

[3].—Due to the occurrence of floods of unprecedented nature, the provision under the Head "Restoration of Flood Damage" was found to be inadequate. An advance of Rs. 125.00 lakhs has already been drawn from the Contingency Fund under this head which is to be regularised through this Supplementary Demand. In addition a further amount of Rs. 60,740.00 out of the loan of Rs. 3 crores given by the Government of India to clear the past liabilities.

[4].—P. W. [B. F. C.] Department was created in the month of July, 1970 and hence no provision under the head "Establishment" could be made for the additional staff recruited for the new department.

[5].—A number of emergency flood control and anti-erosion schemes had to be taken up during the year. An advance of Rs. 50 lakhs has

already been drawn from the Contingency Fund for expenditure on these schemes as there is no budget provision for the purpose. Further, Government of India have very recently sanctioned a loan of Rs. 3 crores to the State Government for flood control works. Supplementary Demand of Rs. 3,34,00,000 under this head includes an amount of Rs. 50 lakhs to regularise the advance already drawn from the Contingency Fund and also to provide an amount of Rs. 3 crores sanctioned by Government of India.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

(1) The original budget provision of Rs. 15,92,000, has already been expended in granting immediate relief, through employment in Test Relief Works, to the victims of this year's unprecedented flood that occurred in all the Plains Districts of the State during the months of June, July, September and October, 1970. After exhaustion of the budget provision this Department had to obtain an amount of Rs. 10,00,000 from the "Contingency Fund" to meet the requirement of remaining most pressing needs of Deputy Commissioners/Subdivisional Officers for the aforesaid purposes. This amount is to be regularised now. Hence the Supplementary Demand.

(2) The above amount is required for giving relief to the people of Mikir Hills affected by flood. The original provision for Test Relief Works being inadequate an additional amount of Rs. 1,65,825 is required. Hence the Supplementary Demand.

(3) The amount is required to render relief to the victims affected by cyclone on 13th November 1970 in Mizo District. As provision under the head was exhausted and as immediate relief was urgently required, the amount of Rs. 99,000 was taken as advance from the Contingency Fund. Hence the demand to regularise the same.

(4) The original budget provision under this sub-head was Rs 16,78,000. When this amount was found to be quite insufficient to cope with the demands of issuing relief in cash and kind, seed grant, rehabilitation grant, etc., as a result of devastation caused by this year's unprecedented flood that visited all the plains Districts of the State during the months of June, July, September and October, 1970, a further amount of Rs. 55,00,000 was obtained by Supplementary Demand during November-December Session of the Assembly, 1970 to meet the most pressing needs on the above mentioned purposes and also for other natural calamities for the remaining period of the financial year. But this amount also fell short of the anticipated demands and it has become necessary to provide additional fund of Rs. 20,15,000, to meet with the remaining needs on above mentioned purposes and particularly of opening of Cheap grain shops and house building in very badly affected areas. Hence, the Supplementary Demand for Rs. 20,15,000.
