### Chapter - I

### Grant No.44

### **Transformation & Development Department**

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments took Grant No. 44 incorporated in the Budget which was presented to the House on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 for the Financial Year, 2025-26 for consideration.

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments has made this Report incorporating all the facts and data given in the Budget and Preliminary Status Paper furnished by the Transformation & Development Department which are briefly focused as follows-

1.1. While examining the papers and documents, as received from the concerned Department in respect of Grant No. 44 and the budget provision made thereto, the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development (D) Departments held the said meeting on 13<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 and took oral evidence from the Departmental representatives for discussing all the points raised by the Hon'ble Members of the Committee.

This will be the First Report for the Grant No. 44 for the Department concerned.

The Budget provision made under Grant No. 44 relating to Transformation & Development Department for the financial year 2025-26 is as given under:

The Committee examined the Major Head of Grant No. 44 and took oral evidence from the Transformation & Development Departmental representatives. The Transformation & Development Department under Grant No.44 comprises/incorporates various schemes taken by the Department for the financial year 2025-26.

### **CHAPTER II**

The Transformation & Development Department has furnished the Preliminary Status relating to Schemes proposed for the SOPD 2025-26 with the particular prominence under Grant No. 44 as follows:

### 2.1 Brief Note of Grant Nos.44

Grant No. 44 pertaining to Transformation & Development Department, basically deal with Schemes under Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER), New Delhi & North Eastern Council (NEC), Shillong, Government of India implemented by concerned line departments of Govt. of Assam.

T&D Deptt. facilitates the line department/IAs in scheme selection, release of fund from MDoNER/NEC. T&D Deptt. does not implement any of the schemes under Grant No. 44.

From 2017 onwards all the Schemes implemented under MDoNER and in FY: 2020-21 NEC has become Central Sector Schemes with 100% funding from Govt. of India. Funds under MDoNER and NEC have been released by Ministry through Central Nodal Agency-NEDFi to vendors via Implementing Agency of State Govt.

The following are the schemes that are being coordinated by T&D Deptt. between MDoNER/NEC and implementing Deptt. for which budget has been required from the State:

- (i) NESIDS OTRI (including earlier NLCPR)
- (ii) Special Development Packages SDP (BTC MoS 2020 & KAATC MoS 2021)
- (iii) Schemes of NEC are funded by NEC, Shillong
- (i) NESIDS OTRI (including earlier NLCPR):

The Non Lapsable Central Pool of Resources (NLCPR) Scheme came into existence in 1998 under then Planning Commission. Subsequently, it was transferred to DoNER in 2001. The objective of NLCPR Scheme is to fill up the gap in infrastructure sector of the North Eastern Region through sanctioning the projects prioritized by the State Governments at a ratio of 90:10,i.e., 90% Central Share and 10% State share.

After discontinuation of NLCPR in 2017, North East Special Infrastructure Development Scheme (NESIDS) a Central Sector Scheme fully funded by the Government of India, was approved with a broad objective to ensure focused development of North East Region by providing financial assistance for projects of (a) physical infrastructure relating to water supply, power, connectivity and specially the projects promoting tourism and (b) social sector for creation of infrastructure in the areas of primary and secondary sectors of education and health.

(ii) Special Development Packages SDP (KAATC MoS 2011): The Memorandum of Settlement (MoS) for Karbi Anglong Autonomous Territorial Council (KAATC) was signed in 2011. The MoS was signed between the Government of India, the Government of Assam and the United People's Democratic Solidarity (UPDS). The MoS provided a Special Economic Package of Rs. 350 crore to the KAATC. (iii) Scheme of NEC: The North Eastern Council is the nodal agency for the economic and social development of the North Eastern Region which consists of the eight States of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. The North Eastern Council was constituted in 1971 by an Act of Parliament in respect of socio-economic development and balanced development of the North Eastern Area and started functioning in the year 1972. Priority funding areas identified by NEC are Tertiary Education, Tertiary Health, Bamboo, Regional Tourism, Livelihoods. Organic NER, Handloom, Handicrafts & Horticulture, Clean& Green NER, Food Processing and Entrepreneurship etc. schemes under NEC are implemented by concerned line departments of govt. of Assam.

#### 2.2 Performance Budget/Annual Report of the Report of 2024-25:

### OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS Grant no. 44

After a great deal of careful consideration of the papers/documents submitted by the Transformation & Development Department and clarification made by the Departmental representatives during the course of tendering their oral evidence the Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments has made the following Observations and Recommendations:

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments observes that there is a need for considerable budgetary provision to be earmarked specifically for Assam considering the areas, population size and larger number of developmental schemes taken up every year in regard to infrastructure, road connectivity, communication, health, education etc.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that NEC should focus for sizable budgetary allocation exclusively for the State of Assam compared to other relevant States considering the ongoing and projected developmental works etc.

With these observations and recommendations as mentioned aforesaid, the Committee recommends that the Budget provision amounting to Rs. 493.00 Lakhs during the financial year 2025-26 under the Grant No. 44 be accepted.

Govt. has taken up to estimate District Domestic Product (DDP) of all 35 Districts of Assam under the project "District Domestic Product Estimation and District Vision Document of Assam". In this respect, Govt. has already executed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Pahle India Foundation, New Delhi for technical support as well as to conduct different survey/studies relating the project. The outcome of the project is to assess the economic health of each District covering all the sectors by using bottom-up approach. After completion of the estimation of DDP, the District Vision Document will be prepared.

### OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

### Grant no. 45

After a great deal of careful consideration of the papers/documents submitted by the Transformation & Development and clarification made by the Departmental representatives during the course of tendering their oral evidence the Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments has made the following Observations and Recommendations.

The Departmentally Related Standing Committee (DRSC) on Development (D) Departments observes that the Renovation of Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko is felt to be urgent in the greater public interest.

The Committee, therefore, strongly recommends that the Department should take necessary steps to opt for SD Proposal for additional budget for renovation work of the Bishnu Rabha Auditorium at Boko under specific scheme, as applicable.

With these observations and recommendations as mentioned aforesaid, the Committee recommends that the Budget provision amounting to Rs. 6208.11 Lakhs during the financial year 2025-26 under the Grant No. 45 be accepted.
