- 1. I, the Chairman of the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development(F) Departments, Assam Legislative Assembly, having been authorized by the Committee to present the Report on its behalf, do hereby present the 1<sup>st</sup> Report of the Committee relating to the Implementation of Assam Accord Department.
- 2. In pursuance of Rule 260-I(1) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in Assam Legislative Assembly, Hon'ble Speaker has been pleased to constitute the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development(F) Departments on 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2025 for a period of one year.

### CHAPTER-I REPORT

## IMPLEMENTATION OF ASSAM ACCORD DEPARTMENT (ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT)

The Assam Accord was signed on 15<sup>th</sup> August, 1985 amongst Union of India, Govt. of Assam, All Assam Student Union, All Assam Gana Sangram Parishad. To implement the various Clauses of Assam Accord a new Department has been established in the name of "Implementation of Assam Accord Department" during the year 1986.

The Implementation of the Assam Accord Department only monitors the works implemented under various clauses of the Assam Accord which is executed by different Department(s)/Organization(s) as entrusted by the Government of India as well as the Govt. of Assam. It also liaises with All Assam Student Union and the different Department(s)/Organization(s) of the Government of India and Government of Assam involved in the process of implementation of the clauses of Assam Accord. There are no any Directorate and Subordinate offices under the Administrative control of this Department. This Department has no physical and financial targets of its own as the Department does not execute any scheme.

As per clause 15 of the Assam Accord the Ministry of Home Affairs is the nodal Ministry for the implementation of the various clauses of Assam Accord.

After the presentation of the Budget Estimates to the House on 10<sup>th</sup> March, 2025 the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Development(F) Departments has scrutinized the demands for Grants for the FY 2025-26.

#### CHAPTER-II

#### **OBSERVATION & RECOMMENDATIONS**

## IMPLEMENTATION OF ASSAM ACCORD DEPARTMENT

Implementation of Assam Accord Department has been newly added in DRSC only to look after various clauses of the Assam Accord which is executed by different Departments/Organizations as entrusted by the Government of India as well as the Government of Assam.

1. The Committee observes that Swahid Divas is being celebrated on 10<sup>th</sup> December every year centrally.

In addition to it, the Committee recommends that Swahid Divas may also be celebrated District-wise to boost the patriotism of Assamese people and remember the martyrs of Assam.

2. The Committee observes that there is no separate Directorate of Assam Accord Department.

Therefore, the Committee recommends to constitute a separate Directorate of the Assam Accord Department.

3. The Committee observes that measures should be undertaken to instil a sense of patriotism amongst all, irrespective of age.

Therefore, the Committee has proposed for making a series of short films maximum 30 minutes duration in the documentary film format on various historical milestones, events, acts of heroism and patriotism etc. that occurred during the historic Assam Agitation (1979-1985).

These short documentary films can be shown to the young school students in both urban and rural areas so that a sense of patriotism as well as awareness of our glorious past is rekindled in the hearts of the people especially the youth.

4. The Committee observes that to make a series of short films on this subject will require adequate budgetary support and as such budgetary support of the department may be enhanced.

The fund will also be required for organization of Editor's Meet/Film Makers Meet/Script Writers to seed the idea of importance of Assam Agitation and also curate the mind of the film makers to start with.

5. The Committee observed that while the Department has one vehicle available,

there are currently no drivers assigned.

Hence, the Committee recommends that the Department may take necessary steps to facilitate the provision of two nos, of drivers and an additional vehicle for the Assam Accord Department.

With these observations, the Committee recommends the total amount of Rs. 7954.5 Lakhs as sought for, under Grant No. 11, Implementation of Assam Accord Department for the financial year 2025-26 be approved by the August House.

The Action taken on the recommendations made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90(ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.
