CHAPTER- I

REPORT

A BRIEF NOTE IN RESPECT OF GRANT NO-37

Food, Public Distribution and Consumer Affairs Department, Govt. of Assam:- The Department of Food, Public Distribution & Consumer Affairs, Government of Assam endeavors to ensure availability of food grains at affordable and reasonable price throughout the State. The department ensures creation of buffer stock, procurement, storage and distribution of food grains to overcome natural calamities.

The Department undertakes supervisory and enforcement duties under the Essential Commodities Act, 1955 and Orders like the Public Distribution System (control) Order, 2001. In Assam, 2.52 crore population has been covered under NFSA'13 (84.17% of rural population and 60.35% of urban population as per census 2011) categorizing them as AAY and Priority Household families.

- B. Legal Metrology: The Department of Legal Metrology is one among the Welfare Departments of the State. The Department is working in the field of weights and measures. But, the department does not implement any beneficiary related scheme.

The main objective of the Legal Metrology Department is to protect the interest of the consumers. This is done by maintaining accuracy of the weights and measures used in all business transaction and protection and also by registering prosecution cases against the violators of the provisions of the Legal Metrology Act and Rules in force at present. The Department also enforces provisions related to Packaged Commodities. To give boost to Legal Metrology infrastructures of the States/UTs, the Strengthening of Weights and Measures Infrastructures of the States/UTs sponsored by Govt. of India(GOI) is being maintained in our State also, which is likely to improve the functioning of the Department leading to consumers protection. The Legal Metrology Department (Weights & Measures) came into existence in the State of Assam in the year, 1960 to maintain an uniform system of Weights and Measures throughout the Country.

At present, the Department is enforcing the following Acts and Rules:

- 1) The Legal Metrology Act, 2009.
- 2) The Legal Metrology (Packaged Commodities) Rules, 2011.
- 3) The Legal Metrology (General) Rules, 2011.
- 4) The Assam Legal Metrology (Enforcement) Rules, 2011.
- 5) The Legal Metrology (Approval of Models) Rules, 2011

The Department of Legal Metrology is working for the welfare of the consumer of the State. There is no specific scheme to implement. Standardization and maintenance of accuracy of all the weights and measures used in various trades and industries in the State is the target of the Department.

Though the Legal Metrology Department is a service oriented department, the Department also earns substantial amount of non-tax revenue every year through verification and stamping of weights and measures by traders, Calibration of storage tank, issue of Dealer License/Packers License, etc. The financial target and achievement w.e.f.2020-21 to 2024-25 are as follows:

Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission and District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commissions Assam were established under Consumer Protection Act.

Consumer Protection Act, 2019 is an Act of the Parliament of India.

Grant No. 46 was allotted to the Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission along with 23 nos. of District Consumer Disputes Redredssal Commission Assam after Govt. of Assam declared Hon'ble President, Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission as HOD. Since this financial year 2024-25, Govt. of Assam has allotted budget under Grant no. 46 to Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission as HOD.

Consumer Protection Act 2019 Details:

- Consumer Protection Act, 2019 is a law to protect the interests of the consumers. This Act provides safety to consumers regarding defective products, dissatisfactory services, and unfair trade practices.
- The basic aim of the Consumer Protection Act, 2019 is to save the rights of the consumers by establishing authorities for timely and effective administration and settlement of consumers' disputes.

Rights of the consumers:

 Consumers have the right to information on various aspects of goods and services. This could be information about the quantity, quality, purity, potency, price, and standard of goods or services. To be protected from hazardous goods and services. Right to protection against goods and services that can be dangerous to life and property.

To be protected from unfair or restrictive trade practices.

• Consumers have the right to access a variety of goods and services at competitive prices.

Consumers should have the right to redressal.

Salient Provisions of the Consumer Protection Act 2019

Now definition of consumer:

The new Act has widened the definition of 'consumer'.

Definition of consumer:

As per the Act, a person is called a consumer who avails the services and buys any good for self-use. Worth to mention that if a person bays any good or avails any service for resale or commercial purposes, he/she is not considered a consumer. This definition covers all types of transactions i.e. offline and online through teleshopping, direct selling or multi-level marketing.

Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission:

- The Act has the provision of the establishment of Consumer Disputes Redressal Commissions (CDRCs) at the national, stata and district levels to entertain consumer complaints.
- The CDRCs will entertain complaints related to:
 - Overcharging or deceptive charging
 - Unfair or restrictive trade practices
 - Sale of hazardous goods and services which may be hazardous to life.

Sale of defective goods or services

E-Filing of Complaints:

- The new Act provides flexibility to the consumer to file complaints
 with the jurisdictional consumer forum located at the place of
 residence or work of the consumer. This is unlike the earlier
 condition where the consumer had to file a complaint at the place of
 purchase or where the seller has its registered office address.
- The new Act also contains enabling provisions for consumers to file complaints electronically and for hearing and/or examining parties through video-conferencing.
- Consumers will also not need to hire a lawyer to represent their caseps.

2. PERFORMANCE BUDGET/ANNUAL REPORT RELATING TO GRANT NO 37 FOR FOOD, PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION & CONSUMER AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT 2024-25

(i) National Food Security Scheme: A budget provision of Rs.52790.50 lakhs (Rs.29273.54lakhs commission and Rs.23516.96 lakhs as transportation totaling to Rs.52790.50 lakhs) has been provided as budget provision during the financial year 2024-25 for payment of commission to the FPSs and transportation cost to transporters in respect of National Food Security Scheme. Out of Rs. Rs.52790.50 lakhs, an amount of Rs.50341.30591 lakhs has been utilized and Rs.2449.19409 lakh is to be utilized within 31 March, 2025. The achievement of FPD&CA department in last 1 year furnished at Annexure-A.

A budget estimate of Rs.52978.22 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for payment of commission to the FPSs and transportation cost to transporters in respect of National Food Security Scheme.

(i) Paddy Procurement Programme: A budget provision of Rs.1026.00 lakhs has been provided for the financial year 2024-25 for opening of paddy procurement Centre in the State. This amount is under process for utilization.

A budget estimate of Rs. 1709.35 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 to recover the differential expenses under paddy procurement programme by Assam Food and Civil Supply Corporation Limited.

(ii) A budget provision of Rs.171.00 lakhs has been provided for the financial year 2024-25 for Assam Food and Civil Supply Corporation. This amount is under process for utilization.

A budget estimate of Rs.171.00 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for Assam Food and Civil Supply Corporation Limited.

- (iii) Confonet Project: -A budget estimate of Rs.5.00 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for payment of bills to BSNL in connection with broadband internet services in respect of Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission and 23 District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commissions.
- (iv) AAMAR DUKAN:- The State Govt. has provided a budget provision of Rs.115.90 lakhs for strengthening of AAMAR DUKAN for the financial year 2024-25 for functioning of 175 nos. of AAMAR DUKAN @ Rs.66,225/- per AAMAR DUKAN. Out of Rs.115.90 lakhs, expenditure incurred for an amount of Rs.74.83 lakhs and balance amount of Rs.41.07 lakhs shall be released on receipt of F. S. proposal from the respective District Commissioners.

A budget estimate of Rs.115.90 lakhs has been proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for providing financial assistance to selected 175 No.s of AAMAR DUKANS.

(v) <u>End-to-End Computerization</u>: A budget provision of Rs.189.88 lakhs has been provided for the current financial year 2024-25 for implementation of End-to-End Computerization of TPDS project and payment of internet connectivity for

continuation of supply chain management, manpower support, security audit of application software's etc. This amount under process for utilization.

A budget estimate of Rs. 199.64 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26for payment of internet connectivity for continuation of supply chain management, manpower support, security audit of application software's etc.

(vii) Samabai Sabalikaran Yojana: A budget provision of Rs.5700.00 lakhs has been provided for payment as Grants-in-Aid @ Rs.26.35 per quintal against quantity handled to each of the GPSSs/LAMPs/WCCs of the State for services rendered by them in the supply chain management of foodgrains for the year 2024-25. Out of Rs.5700.00lakhs, an amount of Rs.4155.78 lakhs has been utilized and balance amount of Rs.1544.22 lakhs is to be utilized within 31 March, 2025.

A budget estimate of Rs.5006.96Lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26.

viii) State Consumer Helpline:- A budget provision of Rs.24.53 lakhs is provided for recurring expenditure for continuous operation of State Consumer Helplinescheme for the financial year 2024-25. This amount shall be utilized on receipt of F.S. and FOC from the Govt.

A budget estimate of Rs.24.53 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26for recurring expenditure for continuous operation of State Consumer Helpline scheme.

CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEME

1. FAIR PRICE SHOP AUTOMATION SCHEME: A budget provision for an amount of Rs.8253.22 lakhs (Rs.2147.21 lakhs as Central Share and Rs.6106.01 lakhs as State Share totaling to Rs.8253,22 lakhs) has been provided for the financial year 2024-25 for implementation of Fair Price Automation Scheme. Out of Rs.8253.22 lakhs, an amount of Rs.5856.22Lakhs has been utilized and balance amount of Rs.2397.00 lakhs shall be utilized on receipt of bill from the AMTRON.

A budget estimate of 6823.48 lakhs is proposed for FY 2025-26 for the scheme.

2. <u>Smart Public Distribution System:</u> A budget provision of Rs. 280.63 was provided for the financial year 2024-25(Rs. 256.16 as central share and Rs.24.47 as state share). Out of Rs. 280.63 lakhs an amount of Rs 35.5767 lakhs has already been utilized and balance amount of Rs.245.053 lakhs will be utilized within 31 March, 2025.

A budget estimates of Rs.245.07 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for implementation of Smart Public Distribution System Scheme.

CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME

1. CONSTRUCTION OF STORAGE GODOWNS:-

A budget provision of Rs.472.51 lakhs (Rs.467.44 lakhs as CSS +Rs.5.07 lakhs as SOPD-SS)was provided for the financial year 2024-25. Out of the budgeted amount of Rs.467.44 Lakhs (CSS) for the F.Y 2024-25 GOI has released Rs.267.75 Lakhs through PFMS in CNA model during the F.Y 2023-24 in the month of March, 2024 and the entire amount has been utilized for the purposes before 31" march, 2024, Hence the budgeted amount remains unutilized during the F.Y 2024-25.

Further, Out of Administrative approval amount of Rs.132.00 Lakhs for construction of Majuli Godowns an amount of Rs.126.95081 Lakhs has been utilized. Out of budgeted amount of Rs.5.07 Lakhs (SOPD-SS) an amount of Rs.5.04919 Lakhs will be utilized before 31" march 2025.

A budget estimate of Rs.112.07lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-2026 for construction of storage godowns.

2. STRENGTHENING THE INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE CONSUMER COURT:-

A budget provision of Rs.0.49 lakhs is provided for the financial year 2024-25 for payment of outstanding bill in construction of Consumer Court building at Nalbari. Out of budgeted amount of Rs. 0.49 Lakhs, Two nos of financial sanction has already been submitted to govt. Rs. 18,386/- will be utilized against the outstanding liabilities for the work construction of consumer court building Nalbari and Rs. 29,616/- will be refunded to Govt of India.

A budget estimate of Rs.0.49 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-2026

3. Consumer Awareness Activities: A budget provision of Rs. 40.04 lakhs is provided for implementation of Consumer Awareness Activities for the financial year 2024-25. Out of the budget amount Of Rs. 40.04Lakhs, a plan & estimate of Rs. 29,92,480 has already received from Assam State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission. The amount will be utilized before 31 March 2025 against the grant sanction received from GOI during the F.Y 2013-14. There is lying as unspent amount of Rs. 10.05575 Lakhs against the grant sanction during the F.Y 2006-07 and 2014-15 received from GOI under the Scheme consumer awareness activities. The unspent amount will be refunded to GOI due to non-utilization by districts.

A budget estimate of Rs.40.04 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26.

4. Construction of Toilet in District Commission: A budget provision of Rs.15.75 lakhs has been provided for the FY 2024-25. Administrative Approval has already been issued to 3 nos of districts. The balance amount will be utilized on receipt of bill from Districts A budget estimate of Rs.15.75 Lakhs is proposed for the FY 2025-26.

5. <u>Strengthening of Weight and Measures:</u> Rs.0.20 lakhs is required for maintenance of mobile kit vans in respect of Legal Metrology for the financial year 2024-25.

PROPOSED EXPENDITURE FOR HEAD QUARTER ESTABLISHMENT AND DISTRICT LEVEL ESTABLISHMENT, ETC.

1. Writing of cards: -A budget provision of Rs. 1116.00 lakhs has been provided for the financial year 2024-25 for payment of writing of cards, refund of fund to CMSGUY against the temporary loan, Rs. 826.32 lakhs FS already received and FOC yet to be received. Out of the total budget provision of Rs.1116.00 lakhs, expenditure has incurred for an amount of Rs.78.00 lakhs. The remaining amount shall be utilized on receipt of financial sanction proposal from the DDOs as well as FOC from Govt.

A budget estimate for Rs.250.00 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for payment in connection with writing of cards.

2. Generating Awareness of TPDS Beneficiaries: -A budget provision of Rs.16.20 lakhs has been provided for Publicity Awareness of TPDS for the financial year 2024-25. Out of Rs.16.20 lakhs, expenditure for an amount of Rs. 14,33,700/- has been incurred and balance amount of Rs.1,86,300/- shall be sanctioned on receipt of bill from the vendor.

A budget estimate of Rs.16.20 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for Publicity Awareness Of TPDS.

3. <u>Mukhya Mantri Anna Suraksha Yojana</u>: A budget provision of Rs.108.16 lakhs provided for the financial year 2024-25 for payment of outstanding transportation bill of MMASY. The aforesaid amount has already been distributed to the DDOs. This amount shall be incurred on receipt of F.S. proposal from the DDOS.

A budget estimates of Rs.611.95 lakhs is proposed for the financial year 2025-26 for payment of outstanding transportation bill of MMASY.

- An amount of Rs.735.24 lakhs for Head Quarter Establishment which Includes Salary, O.E., T.E., RRT etc.
- b) An amount of Rs.3769.48 lakhs for Salary, O.E., T.E. etc for District Level Establishment.
- c) Rs.357.46 lakhs for Salary Wages, TE.OE etc for State Food Commission
- d) An amount of Rs. 77.00 lakhs for Head Quarter Establishment which includes Salary, O.E., T.E etc.

The aforesaid amount of Rs.8097.31 lakhs may be recommended for the financial year 2025-26.

BRIEF NOTE IN RESPECT OF GRANT NO. 46

The Legal Metrology Department (Weights & Measures) came into existence in the State of Assam in the Year. 1960 to maintain an uniform system of Weights and Measures throughout the Country.

At present, the Department is enforcing the following Acts and Rules:-

1) The Legal Metrology Act, 2009.

- 3) The Legal Metrology (General) Rules, 2011.
- 4) The Assam legal Metrology (Enforcement) Rules, 2011.
- 5) The Legal Metrology (Approval of Models) Rules, 2011.

THE MAIN FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGAL METROLOGY ARE AS FOLLOWS:-

- i) In these days of consumers' awareness, the Department plays an important role by maintaining accuracy in all spheres of commercial transaction to protect the interest of the consumers. This Department is functioning to keep vigil on malpractices in the business transactions and to launch cases in case of any violation of the above mentioned Acts and Rules. Thus this Department is a basic infrastructure for the protection of the interest of the consumers.
- ii) Further prosecution cases are registered against the traders, who adopt unfair means to cheat the consumers with frequent inspection to make enforcement drives more effective.
- iii) This Department also undertakes the Calibration of Storage Tanks of Oil and other Industrial establishment and earns revenue accordingly.

Since this financial year 2024-25, Govt. of Assam has allotted budget under Grant No. 46 to Assam State Disputes Redressal Commission as HOD

CHAPTER - II GRANT No.-37

FOOD, PUBLIC DISTRIBUTION AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT OBSERVATIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS ON DEVELOPMENT (F) DEPARTMENTS

1. The Committee observes that though the Govt. has already notified involvement of the local Hon'ble MLA's and MP's as special invitee in the District Level Paddy Procurement Committee, no Hon'ble MLA's and MP's have been informed regarding the said Committee and hence reiterates recommendation no. 1 of the year 2024-25.

The Committee recommends that the Department re-issue letters to all DC's & Principal Secretaries of Autonomous Councils for incorporation of Hon'ble MLA's and MP's in the District Level Paddy Procurement Committee and also to call for minutes of meeting held till date.

- 2. The Committee observed that most of farmers are not registered under paddy procurement schemes in almost every district particularly South Salmara, Mankachar District.
- 3. The Committee observed that the Fair Price shops designated as 'Amar Dukan' are not functioning as per guidelines. The beneficiaries are not getting the listed items at subsidized rate.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that the department prepares specific guidelines to be followed by 'Amar Dukan' concerned officers should vigil repeatedly for transparency of 'Amar Dukan'.

4. The Committee also reiterates recommendation no. 2 of 2024-25 regarding purchase of vehicles for departmental use. The Committee observes that already 9 (nine) districts have official vehicle and rest-24 districts are to avail official vehicles.

The Committee recommends that more vehicles covering all the districts of Assam be purchased for the smooth functioning, enforcement activities and discharging duties more effectively.

5. The committee observed that mustard procurement at minimum support price is affected due to the non fulfillment of the percentage of moisture content as per standards set by the Ministry of Agriculture, GOI.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Department being the Nodal Department is to take up the matter with Government of India and enhance mustered procurement in the State.

6. The Committee in its earlier meetings recommended the department to keep strong vigil for keeping the Electronic Balances in visible position of the customers.

The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation to take steps for maintaining accuracy of the weight and increase the number of inspections, prosecutions with regular surprise inspections.

7. The Committee observed that shortage of manpower in the department hinders the inspection activities repeatedly.

Therefore, the Committee recommends to increase manpower of the Department and execute the duties of checking the vendors repeatedly for transparency.

The Committee recommends that the Budgetary allocation provided under Grant No. 37 for the Financial year 2025-26 for the Food, Public Distribution and Consumer Affairs Department be approved by the August House.

The Action Taken Report on the recommendations made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.

THE LEGAL METROLOGY DEPARTMENT OBSERVATIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS ON DEVELOPMENT (F) DEPARTMENTS

1. The Committee observes that in most of the fair price shops as well as other shops cheat the public by using malpractice in the weight machines.

Therefore, the Committee recommended that a District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission is to be established in all districts. The Committee also recommended the department should submit the list of cases received & disposed of by the State & District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission till date. List of the existing District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commissions is also to be furnished.

2. The Committee in its earlier meetings recommended the department to keep strong vigil for keeping the electronic balances in the visible position of the customers. But the Committee observed that the most of the sellers have not followed the guideline of the department and still adopt dishonest activities for manipulating the electronic balances.

So, the Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation to take strong steps for maintaining accuracy of the weight and measures of all business transaction and book the seller who violates the guidelines of the department and punish as per the existing law.

The Committee recommends that the Budgetary allocation provided under Grant No. 46 for the Financial year 2025-26 for the Legal Metrology Department be approved by the August House.

The Action Taken Report on the recommendations made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.
