The Sports & Youth Welfare Department was created in the year 1987-88 with a view to promote the activities of sports & youth welfare in the State and since then, a good number of schemes have been successfully implemented under the aegis of this Department.

Sports and Games are recognized by all as sound means for physical and mental development of a person. The energy of the youth if channelized properly can be pivotal in community and nation building. To make our generation strong, healthy and disciplined, various schemes for promotion of Sports and Games in the State have been envisaged.

### 1. PRELIMINARY STATUS PAPER RELATING TO GRANT NO. 74

The Sports & Youth Welfare Department has received a budget allocation of **Rs. 14,450.09 lakh** under SOPD and **Rs. 10,769.06 lakh** under Establishment for the year 2024-25, totaling to **Rs. 25,219.15 lakh** for the implementation of various schemes of the department.

- a. Khel Maharan 2.0: Like previous year, the Sports & Youth Welfare Department, Government of Assam has conducted "Khel Maharan 2.0" to reach out to the grassroot level talents in the State of Assam. This mega sports competition is a step towards mobilizing sports at village level and creating an inclusive sports ambience for identifying promising talents.
- b. Grants for Registered Youth Club: The Government of Assam aims to take sports to the grassroots level for nurturing budding athletes throughout the state on a massive scale. An announcement was made during the Budget Speech In 2023-24 to support one Youth Club in each of the Legislative Assembly Constituencies, to have a structured mechanism to host sports events and to take the Khel Maharan Jan Bhagidari movement forward. The Sports & Youth Welfare Department has initiated a new scheme for providing financial Assistance of Rs. 15.00 lakh to one Youth Club in each of the 126 Legislative Assembly Constituencies (LACs) across Assam. Rs. 1600.00 lakhs has been budgeted during this current Financial Year.
- C. Residential Coaching and Training Programme: As a part of the 3 (three) Year Sustainability and Up-scaling Plan of Khel Maharan, The Directorate of Sports & Youth Welfare, Assam, in collaboration with various Sports Associations has conducted 21 Days Residential Coaching & Training programmes with 155 Excellent Players at Sarusajai Stadium. The camp was conducted in five disciplines viz, Athletics, Football, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, and Volleyball, with participants falling under the categories of Under 14 Boys & Girls and Under 17 Boys & Girls. India's best known coaches including Dronacharyas and Arjuna Awardees coached them. 5 football players have been identified for the Balchung Bhutla Football Academy for admission. For participation at the National School Games, the state teams were formed from players who had come through the Khel Maharah route.
- d. Youth Led Development: The Government of Assam has constituted the Assam State Youth Commission for the purpose of empowering youths and for improving their status. The Commission is running three Centres at Dibrugarh, Tezpur and Jorhat for providing JEE and NEET coaching under Bikoxito Jibon Porikalpana.

Three High-Performance Sports and Rehabilitation Centres were set up in Guwahati, and Jorhat, The centres are fully functional, operating at 100% capacity, and catering to the needs of all athletes and players.

e. Infrastructure Boost: With a view to promoting sports by providing children and youth access to ultra modern sports facilities and to create infrastructure suitable to host games and sports of the highest international standards, the Nehru Stadium complex in Ulubari Guwahati is proposed to be renovated and transformed into a world- class sports arena.

## [C] PERFORMANCE / ANNUAL REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT DURING2024-25

a. Khel Maharan 2.0: The GP Level competitions were held in the disciplines of Athletics, Football, Kabaddi, Chess, Road cycling with traditional cycle, from the month of November, 2024. Around 7662093 athletes have registered, out of which 3512144 have participated in the disciplines of Athletics, Football, Kabaddi, Chess, Road cycling with traditional cycle.

The LAC level and district level competitions have been completed, and State level competition is to be held in the month of April, 2025.

An amount of Rs. 5462.06 lakh has been allotted by the Government of Assam for Hosting of **Khel Maharan 2.0**.

**b. Grants for Registered Youth Club:** As per the announcement, the Government of Assam has notified SOP along with a District level selection committee for selecting the clubs in the State.

Financial Assistance @ Rs. 5.00 lakh each to 92 Registered Youth Clubs from 92 LACs (1st List) out of 126 LACs has been provided by the Department during this financial year.

Work order for supply of Sports Goods and Gym Equipments has been issued. By March, the Gym Equipments and Sports Goods will be delivered to the selected youth clubs by the department.

Residential Coaching and Training Programme: The Department conducted a 21-day Residential Coaching and Training Programme for the selected players to participate in the 38<sup>th</sup>National Games, 2025, in Uttarakhand. Assam has bagged 34 medals and secured 24<sup>th</sup>position in the competition. **Medal Tally:**

## c. Youth Led Development:

- In addition to 3 centres at Dibrugarh, Tezpur and Jorhat, the Assam State Youth Commission has added another Centre at Nalbari for providing JEE and NEET coaching under Bikoxito Jibon Porikalpana.
- One new High-Performance Sports and Rehabilitation Centre has also been set up at Kokrajhar in association with Abhinav Bindra Futurtics Ltd, each costing approximately INR 28 crore. The centres at Guwahati and Jorhat are fully functional, operating at 100% capacity, and catering to the needs of all athletes and players.
- ➤ In order to fulfill the state government commitment to promote sports and livelihood through sports, Shri JayantaTalukdar, Olympian Archer has been appointed as Deputy Superintendent of Police under Home & Political Department.
- Also jobs have been offered to the unemployed medal winners at the Goa National Games. A total of 55 such appointments were made during the year. Medal winners who already had jobs were provided with cash incentives.
- Khel Ratna awardee Lovlina Buragohain participated in the Paris Olympic Games, 2024.
- Khel Ratna awardee Lovlina Buragohain and Uma Chetry, Cricketer won silver and gold medal respectively in the 19th Asian Games, 2023, Hangzhou with participation of total 7 players from Assant.
- Assam stood 12th in the overall medals tally winning 56 medals including 14 Gold in National Games 2023 in Goa.
- Assam stood 17th in the overall medals tally winning 24 medals including 5 Gold in Khelo India Youth Games 2023 in Tamil Nadul

1.3. Out of total Budget provision of Rs.18962.32 lakhs made for the financial year 2025-26, Rs.18774.09 lakhs and Rs.188.23 lakhs have been earmarked under the Revenue and Capital Head respectively. It seems that for the financial year 2025-26 an amount of Rs.6231.83 lakhs has been decreased than of the previous year's Revised Budget Estimates (2024-25).

#### CHAPER-II

## OBSERVATION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

### ON GRANT NO.74

### Sports & Youth Welfare

1. The Committee took note of the report of the Sports and Youth Welfare Department that sports infrastructure projects are no longer through it but by the PWD(B).

Therefore, the Committee recommends it will convene a meeting of officials of the Department of Sports and Youth Welfare and the PWD Buildings jointly after the budget session is over to discuss the status of the sports projects.

2. The Committee observes that the Sports infrastructures are not well maintained in many districts.

The Committee recommended that the Department should try and develop a mechanism for the maintenance of newly created sports infrastructure or already existing infrastructure through PPP,if possible, on a revenue sharing model that will generate resources for the Department.

3. The Committee also observed that the Department of Tea Tribes and Adivasi Welfare is constructing various sports infrastructure across the state.

As such the Committee recommended that the TTAW Department should consult the Sports and Youth Welfare Department regarding the technical aspects of construction before going ahead with implementing such sports projects.

4.The Committee observed that there is currently no policy or budget to support Veteran Sports Associations for organizing sports events. The Department however does try to provide limited support on a case to case basis on receipt of petitions.

The Committee recommends that the Department should examine the possibility of supporting such Veteran Sports Associations regularly in the future by budgeting for it.

5.The Committee observed that sports equipment is being provided to one Youth Club in every Legislative Assembly Constituency as per the announcement in the budget speech and that Rs.15 Lakhs is being provided partly in cash and partly in kind-like sports and Gym equipment to each such Youth Club.

The Committee recommends the department to provide the list of Youth Clubs approved and a copy of the SOP prepared. The Committee also recommended that the Department should consider positively any requests received from MLAs for providing basis sports equipment.

6. The Committee reiterated that a plan of action be prepared for facilitating sports activities when the Nehru Stadium is dismantled and when construction work is in progress so that there is no impediment in the promotion of sports in the City during that period.

Therefore, the Committee recommends that alternate Sports complex/Stadiums may be arranged to boost the practice of the sports activities.

7. The Committee observed that without good coaches it will be difficult for Assam to become a sports powerhouse.

The Committee recommends that at least 20 coaches in selected Olympic sports disciplines should be appointed, on contractual basis if necessary, by the sports and youth welfare during this financial year.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation provided under Grant No.74 for the Financial year 2025-26 for Sports and Youth Welfare be approved by the August House.
