

INTRODUCTION

CHAPTER-I

Brief Report (Roads)

Public Works Roads Department, Assam is responsible primarily for construction and maintenance of Roads of the categories State Highways, Major District Roads, Rural Roads and Urban Roads in Assam under the jurisdiction of the department.

The principal function of the Public Works Department is to develop the infra-structure for transport & communications of the State.

The department implements schemes to provide a robust, sustainable, fuel efficient and safe road infrastructure that contributes towards speedy socio-economic development.

The PWRD road network has grown to a size of 70000+ km which comprises of State Highways, Major District Roads, Rural Roads and Urban Roads.

To develop the road network and also to save the road assets from deterioration, the department avails fund from various sources of the following kinds:

- Externally Aided Projects
- Central Sector & Centrally Sponsored Schemes
- NABARD funded schemes
- State's Own Priority Development (SOPD)

The department has a well established organizational set-up with the following directorates:

1. Chief Engineer (Border Roads & NEC Works): Central Sector/ Centrally Sponsored Schemes like PMGSY, NESIDS, NERSDS, CRF, etc.)
2. Chief Engineer (EAP): ARNIP, ASRIP, Assam Bridge Project-I, Assam Bridge Project-II, etc.
3. Chief Engineer (Roads) : SOPD, RIDF and other matters.

The budget allocation for the department for the financial year 2024-25 excluding Salary and other establishment expenditure was as follows:

Out of the total Budget provision of Rs. 1052781.24 Lakhs made for the financial year 2025-2026 Rs. 110316.05 Lakhs and Rs. 942465.19 Lakhs have been earmarked under the Revenue and capital Head respectively. It seems that for the financial year 2025-2026 an amount of Rs. 152255.11 Lakhs has been decreased than that of the previous year's Budget Estimates (2024-2025).

The Action Taken Report on the recommendations made in the Twenty Fifth Report submitted by the Department is appended at the **Annexure-I**.

CHAPTER-II**OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS****P.W. (Roads) DEPARTMENT.**

The Committee thoroughly discussed all the paras under the Grant no. 64 and observed the action taken on the recommendations of the DRSC Committee for the year 2025-2026. After threadbare discussion the Committee recommends as under:

GRANT NO. 64

1. During discussion, the Committee recommends the department to submit a list of total World Bank sponsored bridges i.e. 1184 nos., out of which 953 have been approved and tendering of 598 has been done, 231 remaining.
Further, the Committee recommends that for the remaining 231 bridges, the target may be fulfilled by collecting name and location of new bridges from the LACs where the bridges were dropped for various reasons.
Moreover, the Committee also recommends the department to submit LAC wise list of dropped bridges from the remaining 231 bridges.
2. During discussion, the Committee recommends conversion of remaining parts of embankment from Kharmuja to Nichinpur to pucca road in Goalpara District.
3. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.6 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) regarding construction of RCC Bridge over the river Jaljali connecting Paharpara and Nagarbera.
4. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.7 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) regarding "water logging problem arising in Tetelia LP School under West Guwahati LAC mostly creating inconvenience in transportation of the general public."
5. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.8 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to complete the half done/incomplete roads, bridges and culverts under PMGSY Schemes immediately.
6. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.9 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to take over the Simoluguri to Naginimara Roads from Border Roads Organization and to make improvement.
7. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.10 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to make an extra Head of Accounts of Rs. 25 Cr for emergency/routine maintenance works (Culverts, Road and SPT bridge repair and bridge approach). The Committee directed the department for making a budgetary provision of Rs. 20 Lakhs per territorial subdivision for maintenance works.
8. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.11 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to include the following roads under Nagariya Pakipath Scheme:
 - i. Muwamari to Bagi Chowk via Odola Kahibari link Road to Udalguri-Tamulpur man road.
 - ii. Road from Pragjyotishpur to Namoni Kamakhya Railway Station at Maligaon, Guwahati.

- iii. Road from Balijana to Borjhora in Goalpara West.
- iv. Main road of Baikunthapur Village near Game Village, Beltola, Guwahati.
- v. Bye-lane A/2, Shankar Nagar opposite Hanuman Mandir, Lakhra Road, Adagudam, Guwahati – 34 of length about 150m.
- vi. Bhaskar Path (1st Bye-lane of Rudra Singh Path) to Shankardev Tiniali, Usha Nagar, Barbari.
- vii. Shivanagar, Megzin, Mahapurush Madhav Dev Path (VIP Road).
- viii. Bye-lane-1, Trinayan Path, Kundil Nagar, Kalitakuchi, Birkuchi, Narengi.

9. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.12 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to construct an alternative bridge near Namdang Sil Sako at Gaurisagar and also emphasis on preservation of Namdang Sil Sako Bridge a heritage at the earliest.

Further, the Committee recommends that the Namdang Sil Sako has hertiage value and may be handed over to Archaeology Department for preservation.

10. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.13 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to upgrade the Lohit Khabulu Bridge K.B Road connecting Majuli Lakhimpur as Majuli Jorhat in North Bank at the earliest.
11. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.15 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to complete the balance work of construction of Bridge at Namdang River (Khamun Abhoyapuri Bridge) at the earliest.
12. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.17 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) to construct RCC Bridge no. 5/1 on Purangaon Jaokatadiya Deka Chang Road (length-150m) over the river Kolohi under Boko LAC, Kamrup District.
13. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.18 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) for construction of flyover over the railway line to connecting Jugijan Bazar with South Jugijan.
14. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.19 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) for construction of a bridge over the Jugi River to connect the Rajbari and Sivpur areas to promote tourism alongwith connecting the new delimited area of Rajagaon.
15. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No.21 of the 25th Report (2024-2025) for construction of a flyover instead of an elevated road on Silchar Kalain Road from Kargil point to Shivbari Road for a length of 600 metres.
16. After threadbare discussion, the Committee recommends the department to construct Road from Ghopergaon to Padupara Deosila Bridge in Goalpara District, Ziaguri Road in Goalpara District and Khalisamari Road in Goalpara District.
17. During discussion, the Committee recommends the department to construct SH-043 Road from Khalishabhita, Lakhimpur, Kharmuja Goalpara, Matia, Simlitola, Ouguri, Chandubi lake.

18. After threadbare discussion, the Committee recommends the department for Construction of Paver Block Road from Bhupen Bhuyan house to Dubapara High School field for convenience of the local residents of the Dihing Satra Dubapara, Goalpara.
19. During discussion, the Committee recommends for construction of over bridge at Bechamari on NH-15.
20. During discussion, the Committee recommends for construction of overbridge at Dalgaon on NH-15.
21. The Committee recommends that the Assam State Zoo may be shifted to a new place like a non-functional tea garden located at Bordua near Borihat, Rani and the present compound may be converted to Urban Forest like Nehru Park, New Delhi.
22. For proper preservation of Rang Ghar and Talatal Ghar, the Committee recommends the department to consult with heritage conservation expert group before starting any renovation or preservation work. Also, the Committee decided to visit Rang Ghar and Talatal Ghar for field observation regarding water logging problems and to observe the progress of on-going projects on a convenient date.
23. During discussion, the Committee recommends construction of Road from Kalaguru Bishnu Prasad Rava Samadhi Satra to Kalia Bhomora Bridge, River Bank of Brahmaputra.
24. During discussion, the Committee recommends construction of Mazbat (Sikaridanga) to Bhairabkunda tourist spot and Bhutan link road (inter-state border road)
25. During discussion, the Committee recommends for construction of RCC Bridge over Dhansiri river at Borobajar on Borobajar to Borjhar Road.
26. During discussion, the Committee recommends construction of (i) Fatasil Ambari Flyover and (ii) Azara-Rani Chowk Flyover over Railway over bridge.
27. The Committee recommends to construct the existing road with CC blocks along with side drain (Length-250 Metre & Breadth- 6 Metre) located at Nalapara, Kali Mandir Road, Byelane-Sonali Path, Ward No-43 Guwahati, Kamrup (M), Assam.
28. The Committee recommends to construct and upgrade the 6th No. Byelane of Soti Joymoti Nagar, B.G Colony Maligaon, Municipal Ward No.2 under West Guwahati Constituency.
29. The Committee recommends to construct the Aton Buragohain Path cum Drain located at Sukafa Nagar, Hatigaon, Notbama, Guwahati.
30. The Committee recommends the department for construction of bridge over Daranga river from Kumarikata to Nayabasti under Asom Mala Scheme on public interest.
31. The Committee observes that all the roads from Jorhat District leading to Sibsagar, Charaideo district like NH, Dhodar Ali, B.G.Road etc, have been in deplorable condition for many years.

Hence, the Committee recommends to take immediate steps to improve those roads.

32. The Committee recommends the department for widening of road from Ganeshguri to Powerhouse via Jyoti Chitrabon, Jatia road, Guwahati.
33. The Committee observes that due to narrow bridge at Swahid Dilip Huzuri Path connected to GS Road at Super Market, Dispur which causes severe traffic jam, as the bridge is not fit to allow two vehicles at a time. Hence, the Committee recommends the department to take necessary steps for widening of the bridge for public convenience.
34. The Committee has also decided to undertake a visit at Batadrava Satra and Assam State Zoo cum Botanical Garden to observe the on-going projects on a convenient date.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation provided under Grant No.64 for the financial year 2025-26 for PWD (Roads) be approved by the August House.

The Action Taken Report on the recommendations made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation in the House.
