### AT A GLANCE:

Directorate of Elementary Education has been functioning to cater the social needs and specially to achieve the goal of Universalization of Elementary Education (UEE) bringing all children of school going age into the school system as per provision of RTE Act/2009. This Directorate is functioning w.e.f. 7/7/1977 as a separate Directorate.

#### Back ground:

- Universalization of Elementary Education as focused in the National Policy on Education, 1986 and Programme of Action (1986, revised in 1992) envisaged the efforts
- To make provision for a Primary School within the waitable distance to enroll all children of 6 years age.
- · To retain them in the school fill completion of the elementary schooling and
- To provide quality education of comparable standard.

- Students Admission in Private Schools for BPL students as per RTE Act 2009 implemented by SSA.
- Honorarium to Mid-Day Meal Workers implemented by SSA.

### Introduction:

The Parliament has passed the Bill for providing free and compulsory education to all children up-to the age group of 14 years as 'The Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education' to become a legislation in 2009 and RTE Act, 2009 which came into force in April, 2010. Now, it has become a mandatory task for the State to implement programs as per the Act. Accordingly, the Government of Assam issued notification dated 11th July, 2011 "The Assam Right of Children to Free and compulsory Education Rules, 2011" to implement the RTE, Act, 2009.

### PRADHAN MANTRI POSHAN SHAKTI NIRMAN (FORMERLY KNOWN AS MID-DAY MEAL SCHEME)

With a view to enhancing enrolment, retention and attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among children the National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (NP-NSPE) popularly known as Mid-Day Meal Scheme was launched as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme on 15th August 1995, initially in 2408 blocks in the country From 2008-09 i.e. w.e.

f. 1st April, 2008 the programme covers all children studying in Government Local Body and Government eided primary & Upper Primary school and centres supported under SSA (presently Samagra Shiksha) of all areas across the country. Mid-Day Meal Scheme was started in the State of Assam during 2004-05 financial year. The name of the scheme has been changed to Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PM – POSHAN) in September, 2021. Children of preparatory classes i.e. classes before class-I in primary schools have been included in PM-POSHAN since April, 2022.

#### Provision under the PM POSHAN:

- Serving hot cooked meal to all children in all schools days as per entitlement and norms.
- Implementation of School Health Programme at school level which includes WFIS (Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementation) and administering de-worming tablets etc. in convergence with RBSK.
- Setting up School Nutrition Gardens.
- Sabka Prayas –Sampriti Bhojan : Community members voluntarily provide food items to the children on special occasional festivals
  etc.
- Social Audit of implementation of the scheme.
- Weekly two additional eggs were introduced for the eligible children of Tea Garden areas w.e.f. August, 2023 and to the eligible children of Char & Chapon areas of Assam w.e.f. December, 2023 in order to increase attendance of the children and also to improve nutritional status of the same. On every Monday and Friday, additional eggs are served in the schools of Tea Garden, Char & Chapon areas of Assam along with compulsory provision of one egg on every Wednesday. 2,49,042 children of 2429 schools in Tea Garden Areas and 2,23,854 children of 1980 schools in Char & Chapon areas of Assam are benefited under the

#### Major Schemes Undertaken during 2022-23:-

#### 1. Establishment of Model Schools in Tea Garden Areas :-

Tea community is an integral part of the greater Assamese society and it has contributed immensely to the states Socio-cultural growth. Due to non availability of high schools in the tea garden areas, a large number of students leave schools midway. With a view to provide access to Secondary Education in un-served areas and to augment academic environment in the tea garden areas in Assam, the State Government of Assam had takensteps for setting up of 118 Model High Schools. It was for the first time that after 75 years of India's Independence, high schools were set up in tea garden areas. Out of 118 Model schools, 97 Schools were already functional from the academic session 2022-23. The remaining 21 Model Schools in Tea Garden areas are targeted to be functional during the academic session 2023-24.

These schools are provided with all amenities like modern class rooms, teacher's rest rooms, entrance gates, separate toilets for teachers and students etc.

16140 students have been enrolled in these 97 Schools. The children of these schools are provided with Mid-Day Meal, Free Uniform and Free Textbooks etc.

#### 2. AROHAN:-

A flagship scheme of the State Government, in brief is a Mentor-Mentee programme for meritorious students of the class-IX - XII. Under this scheme, the meritorious students were provided support through mentoring/ counseling for career progression, exposure and incentive either in cash or kind. The Mentees (students): The toppers in the Annual Examination in class- VIII during 2021-22 (studying in class IX in 2022-2023) of the schools were the Mentees of the programme in the year 2022-23. A total of 4438 students (one per school) of Government/ Provincialised Schools, Adarsha Vidyalayas, Tea Garden Model schools and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas having class IX were covered in the financial year 2022-23.

#### 3. AnundoramBorooah Award :-

Anundoram Borooah Award was given to 22601 meritorious students who had passed the HSLC Examination with 75% marks and above @Rs.16000/- each as a token of recognition and support of their achievement and for motivating and inspiring the students for better performance.

During the year 2022-23, total amount of Rs.3616.16 Lakhwas provided on DBT Mode under this scheme.

#### 4. Free Textbooks to students studying class IX to XII under Secondary Education:

The Govt. had introduced an ambitious scheme to provide free text books to the students of class 1X & X from the academic year 2016-17. The scheme was extended to the students of Class XI & XII in five core subjects in the stream of Science, Commerce, Arts and Vocational from the academic session 2018-19. Total 11,61,614 number of students were benefited under this Scheme during the financial year 2022-2023.

#### 5. Waiving of admission fees and tuition fees:

With an objective to provide free education to the under privileged and the poorer section of students, the Govt. of Assam had decided to waive the admission fees/tuition fees etc. for the students taking admission in both HS Schools and Colleges. The limit of parental income for getting such fee waiver is Rs.2.00 lakh.

#### 6. Waiving of examination fees:

Examination fees for the HSLC/HSSLC examination to the students of poorer section of society were waived off from the academic session 2016-17. The scheme was implemented during the financial year 2022-23.

#### 7. Free Uniform to students of Class IX & X:

The Govt. of Assam had introduced the scheme for providing free uniform to the students of class IX & X in Govt. and Provincialised High/Higher Secondary Schools. The Samagra Shiksha, Assam is the implementing agency for providing free uniform to the students of class IX & X. The scheme was also implemented during the financial year 2022-23.

#### 8. Scholarship Scheme for Minority Girls Students:

The Govt. of Assam has been implementing the scheme to provide scholarship to the girl students belonging to Minority Communities @ Rs.2000/- for class X and Rs.4000/- for classes XI & XII standard students. Total 28500 Girl Students were benefited under the Scheme during 2022-23.

#### 9. Differently Abled Scholarship Scheme :-

Physical Disability scholarship is awarded to differently abled students studying in class IX to XII in Government Secondary Schools. Students studying in class IX & X get scholarship amount @Rs.4800/- P.A. and the students studying in class XI & XII get scholarship @Rs.6000/- P.A. Total 408 students were benefited under this Scheme during the financial year 2022-23.

#### 10. RIMC & Sainik School Incentive :-

(i)RIMC- This scholarship is given to the domicile students of Assam studying at Rashtriya Indian Military College, Dehradun @Rs.50,000/- PA. 4(four) students were benefited under this Scheme during the financial year 2022-23.

(ii)Sainik School-This scholarship is awarded to the domicile students of Assam studying at Sainik School, Goalpara. A total 427 numbers of students were benefited amounting to Rs.1,49,87,700/during the financial year 2022-23.

#### 11. Amalgamation of Secondary Schools :-

#### Major Schemes Undertaken during 2023-24:-

1. Providing Free Bi-cycle: The Government of Assam introduced a new schemeduring the FY 2023 -2024 for providing Free Bicycle to all students studying inClass-IX in Government and Provincialised Secondary Schools, including Tea GardenModel Schools as well as Adarsha Vidyalayas of Assam. There are total 3,69,366 students both boys & girls studying in Class - IX are benefited under the Scheme during the academic year 2023. The Scheme has already been successfully implemented.

- 2. Anundoram Borooah Award: The Anundoram Borooah Award Scheme was launched for motivating and inspiring the students for better performance and tohave first-hand experience with Information and Communication Technology. Thesole aim is to enhance healthy competition amongst the student community and tohelp them to enrich their perception through up-to-date knowledge and information with the help of information Technology as well as financial support in their endeavor for higher studies. This year, total 27183 students who have secured 75% and above Marks in HSLC Examination, 2023 have been awarded @Rs.15,000/- as "Anundoram Borooah Cash Award".
- 3. Free Textbooks under Secondary Education: The Govt. have introduced an ambitious scheme to provide free text book to the students of class IX and class X from the academic year 2016-17. The scheme is continuing and Free Text Book has already been distributed among 12,55,063 students studying in Class—IX to XII during the academic year 2023-24.
- 4. Waiving of admission fees and tuition fees: With an objective to provide free education to the under privileged and the poorer section of students, the Government have waived the admission fees etc. for the students taking admission in H.S. 1st Year & 2nd Year in Provincialised & Govt. Higher & Sr. Secondary Schools. Total 197744 students were benefited under this Scheme during the financial year 2021-22. This year an amount of Rs.1755.00 Lakh is earmarked in the Budget for implementation of the Scheme during the year 2023-24, out of which Rs.1616.54 Lakhs has already been released.
- 5. <u>Minority Scholarship</u>:- Scholarship is provided to the girls students belonging to the Minorities Communities studying in Class-X to XII in different Secondary Schoolsof Assam (Government/ Provincialised/ Private Institution). Total 34,267 students had been benefited under this Scheme during the financial year 2023-24.
- 6. Construction of New School Building: To improve the infrastructure of Secondary schools, the Govt. of Assam have already accorded Administrative Approval for infrastructure development of 126 (Govt. & Prov.) Secondary Schools in each LAC's of the State.
- 7. Establishment of 118 nos. Model High Schools in Tea Garden Areas:-Tea community is an integral part of the greater Assamese society and it has contributed immensely to the states Sociocultural growth. With a view to augment academic environment in the tea garden areas in Assam, the State Government has established 118 Model High Schools. It was for the first time that after 75 years of India's Independence, High Schools were set up in tea garden areas. The children of these schools are being provided with Mid-Day Meal, Free Uniform and Free Text books etc. At present 116 Tea Garden Model Schools are functional and 2 Nos of Tea Garden Model Schools are yet to be inaugurated.
  - Moreover, the Department of School Education is taking necessary actions for establishment of another 100 new Model Schools in Tea Garden Areas.
- 8. <u>Appointment:</u> Post Graduate Teacher, Graduate Teachers, Grade-III and Grade-IV(MTS)have been appointed in Government Provincialised Secondary Schools and office of the Director of Secondary Education, Assam and Inspectorate of Schools shown as below.

- 10. <u>Arohan Scheme:</u> Students securing 1st rank in class IX will be provided with tablets under this scheme, which will be connected with a central agency providing educational material and mentorship.
  - The exposure visit to premier institutions and organizations is being conducted from the month of January, 2023 to November, 2023 in phases and till date total 3364 Mentees from 31 districts have completed their exposure visit.
  - Another 445 no. of students are being targeted from 2 districts during the financial year 2023-2024.
  - Book Grant of Rs. 1000/-each to all 8664 mentees has been transferred to their Bank Accounts through DBT.
  - A day-long interactive session for the Mentees of Class-IX has been organized with the DC, SP, Mentors, and other eminent persons of the district over lunch.
  - Tender process has already been invited to provide the tablets incorporating educational materials to the Mentees within the CFY.

- 11. Online portal for Transfer &posting of Teachers: In the last F.Y., total 13,773 teachers have been transferred through HRMIS portal, wherein, cost for transfer of per teacher was Rs.1000/-. Hence, total cost was Rs.137.73 Lakh.
- 12. - 13. Waiving of Examination fees, Centre Fees, etc. to the BPL Students: This scheme aims to exempt the examination fees payable to SEBA and AHSEC of Students whose family income is below 2.000 Lakh per annum. In this connection, a total of Rs.4325.20 lakh is allotted during 2023-24, out of which Rs.2378.86 Lakh is allotted to SEBA and Rs.1946.34 Lakh is allotted to AHSEC.

During the year 2024-25, total 26,969 students who have secured 75% and above Marks in HSLC Examination, 2024 conducted by SEBA (now, ASSEC, Div-I) have been awarded @Rs.12,500/- as "Amundoram Borooah Cash Award".
- 3. Mukhya Mantrir Nijut Moina Aasoni: This scheme aim to provide financial grant as admission incentive to the all girls students studying in Class-XI, which will be instrumental in boosting the interest and energy of the students to come to School regularly and to eliminate the social evil of child marriage. This is further expected that providing of a financial assistance to every Girls Student in Class-XI will help in reducing dropout among the girl students and thereby will increase their retention and improve the transition rate from Secondary to Graduate level. Under the scheme, the 102154 girl students enrolled in Class-XI at Govt. & Venture educational institutions under Govt. of Assam have been receiving financial benefit @ Rs.1000 per month for 9(nine) months.
- 4. Free Text books under Secondary Education: The Govt. have introduced an ambitious scheme to provide free text book to the students of class IX and class X from the academic year 2016-17. The scheme is continuing and 96,66,830 Free Text Books have already been distributed among 12,15,787 students studying in Class-IX to XII during the academic year 2024-25.
- 5. Waiving of admission fees and tuition fees: With an objective to provide free education to the underprivileged and the poorer section of students, the Government have waived the admission fees to the BPL students taking admission in Class-XI and XII in the Govt. and Provincialised Secondary Schools. Total 250899 students are benefitted under this Scheme during the financial year 2024-25 and Rs.1800.00 Lakh has been released for the purpose.

The Department of School Education has created 4669 Regular Graduate Post (Personal to the incumbent) for regularization of the existing 4669 Additional (Contractual) Teachers working in different Secondary Schools of Assam as Graduate Teacher through Special Recruitment Drive and total 4529 teachers have been regularized.

- 8. Online portal for Transfer posting of Teachers: During the year 2024-25, total 1536 teachers have been transferred through HRMIS portal till date. Out of these 1132 nos have been mutually transferred and 404 have been transferred on single transfer mode.
- 9. Waiving of Examination fees, Centre Fees, etc. to the BPL Students: This scheme aims to exempt the fees payable to SEBA and AHSEC (now, ASSEB Div-I and II) as examination fees for HSLC and HS final examination by the BPL Students studying in Govt. and Provincialised Secondary Schools. In this connection, a total of Rs.4500.00 Lakh has been released during 2024-25, out of which Rs.2942.05120 Lakh is allotted to SEBA (now, ASSEB, Div-I) for 277038 nos students and Rs.1557.94850 Lakh is allotted to AHSEC (now, ASSEB, Div-II) for 126436 nos students.

This year total 13 numbers of Teachers (8 Teachers from Secondary Schools and 5 Teachers from Elementary Schools) have been awarded with the Sate Award to Teachers, 2024.

17 The committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No. 14 of the Report No. 59 to upgrade Jania High Schoo, Balagaon High School, Govindapur High School, Kholabondha High School, Ajgar Ali Memorial High School, Senimari Azaad Iligh School, Bartal High School, Gowaphulbari High School, JOC Janata High School, Sikarbitha High School, Bhoiraguri High School in Barpeta District, Gohal Kona High Schools of Boko and Dolmara High School, Kalipukhuri High School Kokrajhar District to Higher Secondary School with appointment of PG teachers in those Schools.

The present policy is for upgrading only those High School to Higher Secondary School that has adequate infrastructure, and availability of subject wise PG qualified Graduate teachers, and accordingly the following 4 number of schools are upgraded:

- Dholmara High School: Dholmara High School has been upgraded to Higher Secondary School vide Order No.E-512582/6 dated 15/07/2024.
- Balagaon High School Regarding the proposal for up-gradation of Balagaon High School, the criteria are being re-examined
- > Due to non-fulfillment of Govt. guidelines regarding up-gradation of schools following schools could not be considered for up-gradation.

# OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS ELEMENTARY EDUCATION, 2025-26 GRANT NO-71

- 1. The Committee after careful consideration and observations has recommended to provide dedicated budget provision for foundational learning, teacher training and holistic skill development. The Committee also recommends for Strengthening basic literacy, numeracy, digital learning from early stages; initiating vocational skill hubs in Schools focussing on Coding, Al, real life experience of organic farming and traditional crafts; developing sports and artistry infrastructures for physical and mental wellbeing, developing regional language based digital contents; Special education resources for differently abled learners etc.
- The Committee observes that the early childhood care and intervention is required for vital growth and Development of Children. Therefore, the Committee strongly recommends the recruitment of visiting Early Interventionist & Childhood Care Professional (at least BPT) with honorarium in School/cluster of Schools.
- 3. The Committee observes that the foundation courses in Elementary school level are most important. Therefore, the Committee recommends to implement dedicated Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) initiative with proper monitoring of age group of 3-8 years.
- 4. The Committee after careful consideration has recommended for more fund for strengthening Anganwadi-Pre-school integration and to upgrade all Anganwadi Centres with trained teachers, digital tools, and play-based pedagogy.
- 5. The Committee recommends to recruit trained /Professional physio (at least BPT) for early childhood care and intervention.
- 6. The Committee observes that the most of the BEEO Offices in the state are in a dilapidated condition. Therefore, the Committee strongly recommends to renovate all such BEEO Offices with special reference to Ghilamara and Batadrava.
- 7. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No. 3 of Report No-64 to constitute School Management Development Committee (SMDC) incorporating Local MLA as the Member of the Committee for smooth functioning of the school.

- 8. The Committee recommends to incorporate Arabic as an optional subject in Elementary Schools and immediate fill up the vacant posts of Arabic in various schools.
- 9. The Committee recommends to incorporate local MLA during the School building construction foundation and on the day of opening of the School building.
- 10. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation No. 17 of Report No-64 that the residential accommodation of hostels/quarters in remote areas may be constructed for women and girl teachers.
- 11. The Committee recommends to establish a Kasturba Balika Bidyalaya in Rupsi Block in Jania.
- 12. The Committee recommends to upgrade Ujankupa ME School under Hailakandi BEEO to High School and Dinanathpur ME School to High School of Katlicherra BEEO, Dharapur ME School to High School of Katlicherra BEEO.
- 13. The Committee after careful consideration has recommended to provide mid-day meal to all venture schools of the state having huge numbers of students with special reference to Nabajyoti ME School in Nazira, Bengali Garigaon ME School in Amguri. The Committee also recommends that the teachers rendering services in the venture schools which could not be provincialized due to date factor should provide fixed lumpsum financial grant prior to enforcement of the Assam Venture Educational Institutions (Provincialisation of Services) Act, 2011.
- 14. The Committee observes that some of the schools are not provincialized although they are giving services for the SC, ST, OBS & Tea, Ex-Tea students in the remote border areas and char areas. Therefore, the Committee recommends to provincialized such schools with special reference to Nagaon Mazdur ME School, Santak; Mackeypore Chah Bagicha ME School, Mackeypore; Sibbari Garden ME School, Gelakey; Santak Bagicha Chah Janajati ME School; Navodaya ME School, Bongali Gaon Sivasagar; Nazirating Tiniali ME School; Charaihajia Simantawarti Nagar Sramik LP School, Napukuri & Maibel Majdoor ME School of the state.
- 15. The Committee recommends to appoint atleast five teachers in five classes in primary schools.

# OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS SECONDARY EDUCATION, 2025-26 GRANT NO-71

- 1. The Committee after careful consideration has recommended for enhancement of budgetary provision for quality enhancement and sustenance, equipment in all Schools with smart classrooms, STEM labs, library procurements AI powered digital tools, free internet and digital learning resources; expand vacation skill based education by establishing state run skill hubs in schools and introducing robotics, AI and entrepreneurships development in curriculum; establish state run facilitating centre for industry, academia linkage; maintain School buildings, labs and libraries, playground sanitation etc. for conducive learning environments and facilitate continuous teacher training at Secondary level.
- 2. The Committee observes that the government has established model schools across various districts with fund allocated for School Buildings and Infrastructure development. However, residential facilities are not available for the students of the under privileged areas. To maximise enrolment, retention, academic performance and holistic growth of student, budget allocation is essential for setting up boarding facilities and necessary support systems in selective schools on the basis of geographic locations and inconvenient transportation. The Committee recommends for implementation of the residential module in Schools like Ghilamara Model School on priority basis. Moreover, the Committee observes that the school building of Showpur model school is already completed. Therefore, the Committee recommends to start classes immediately in Showpur Model School at Jania LAC.
- 3. The Committee observes that Dhakuakhana Govt. MV School has been upgraded to Secondary level School by the Govt. on the occasion of the School's sesquicentennial celebration. Therefore, the Committee strongly recommends to appoint subject wise required numbers of teachers, supporting staff and appointment of Principal for smooth running of the school.
- 4. The Committee after careful consideration has recommended to construct boundary wall in Lakhipur High School of Nilak GP, Misamari High School of Shripani GP, Kerekani High School, Sisibargaon GP of Dhemaji.

- 5. The Committee after careful consideration has recommended to provide mid-day meal to all venture schools of the state having huge numbers of students with special reference to Bihubor Hiloni High School in Nazira and also to provincialized the school.
- 6. The Committee observes that there are a few number of teachers appointed against huge numbers of students in several schools in the state. Therefore, the Committee recommends to appoint required numbers of teachers in such schools with special reference to Khalabandha High School where there are only seven teachers appointed against 1100 students in Chenga.
- 7. The Committee recommends for infrastructural development of the High Schools which have completed 75 years or more. The Committee also recommends to appoint subject wise eligible teachers in such schools with special reference to Dhakuakhana Higher Secondary School.
- 8. The Committee recommends to merge L.K. High School, Chikar Bhitha High School and Jadavpur High Schools with the M.E. School which is situated in the same campus.
- 9. The Committee recommends to provincialize the High Schools which were converted from Madrassa School.
- 10. The Committee recommends to introduce English speaking courses in the XI<sup>th</sup> standard in the secondary schools.
- 11. The Committee strongly recommends to appoint subject wise Post-Graduate Teachers in the upgraded Higher Secondary School in the state.

THE COMMITTEE, HOWEVER, RECOMMENDS THAT THE BUDGETARY ALLOCATION PROVIDED UNDER GRANT NO-71 FOR THE YEAR 2025-2026 be VOTED FOR THE SCHOOL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT BY THE AUGUST HOUSE.
