OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

INDUSTRIES, COMMERCE & PUBLIC ENTERPRISES DEPARTMENT GRANT NO- 58 & 60

After presentation of the Budget in the House for the Financial Year 2025-26 and after having a threadbare discussion on Preliminary status paper, Action Taken Report, the Committee made the following Observations and Recommendations.

- 1. The Committee recommends to enhance the production unit at State Level, and also to develop their own online supply website and App for selling and procurement from local market.
- 2. The Committee recommends with a request to R&DM Department to allocate available land to Industries, Commerce & Public Enterprise (IC&PE) Department for establishing and creation of Industrial Hubs in each and every Assembly Constituency.
- 3. The Committee has observed that ITI centre in Kohora(Kaziranga) is in non-functional condition. Therefore, the Committee recommends to closely work with Skill, Employment & Entrepreneurship Department (SEED) to set up atleast one ITI Center in each and every Assembly Constituency across the State. Further, as requested by the Hon'ble MLA, Sivsagar LAC, one no. of ITI may be established in Sivsagar LAC.
- 4. The Committee reiterates its earlier recommendation to set up Food Packaging and Processing Industry/Common Facility Center(CFC) in each Assembly Constituency across the State. IC & PE Department to co-ordinate with Revenue & Disaster Management (R&DM) Department to take every possible step to allocate land for the above purpose.
- 5. The Committee recommends that the Department should develop one Standard Operating methodology like single window or portal by mentioning the detailed process for registration of new entrepreneur to make the registration process transparent.
- 6. The Committee observes that there is minimal involvement of local Self Help Group (SHG). Further, the Committee recommends for involvement of local Self Help Groups (SHG) for establishment of food processing units in each and every Assembly Constituency.
- 7. The Committee recommends to look into the matter of proper waste disposal of the Industrial Units under Greater Palashbari area (Kamrup).

- 8. The Committee recommends spot visit / tour programmes to various Industrial Hubs.
- 9. The Committee recommends that the Department should conduct a survey through Revenue and Disaster Management Department to see the availability of suitable Land for the Industries which will be established through Advantage Assam 2.0.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation under Grant No. 58 & 60 for the Financial Year 2025-26 be for the Industries, Commerce & Public Enterprises Department be approved by the august House.

The Action taken Report on the recommendations may be submitted to the Committee within 90(ninety) days from the date of presentation of the Report in the House.
