#### **BRIEF NOTE IN RESPECT OF GRANT NO. 65:**

Grant No. 65 plays a pivotal role in supporting the Tourism Department of Assam, focusing on leveraging the state's abundant tourism potential. Acknowledging the global significance of tourism as a rapidly growing and environmentally friendly industry, the grant aims to contribute significantly to the economic development of the region while addressing unemployment concerns.

Assam, endowed with rich biodiversity, diverse cultures, historical landmarks, and scenic landscapes, stands as a prime destination for tourists. The tourism offerings include wildlife experiences, unique cultural practices, the world's largest river island, Majuli, with its Vaisnavite culture, vast tea gardens, the historical Tai Ahom Royal ruins at Sivasagar, the majestic Brahmaputra River, and the Golden Muga, among other attractions.

Furthermore, the Tourism Department actively engages in the promotion and development of tourism-related infrastructure. This collaborative effort involves partnerships with the private sector and coordination with other relevant departments. The note underscores the importance of sufficient investments and integrated efforts from all stakeholders to fully explore and capitalize on the tourism potential of Assam. The overarching goal is to boost tourism as a catalyst for economic growth, job creation, and to showcase the distinctive offerings of Assam to visitors.

#### PRELIMANARY STATUS PAPER RELATING TO GRANT NO. 65:

- f. Goals and Objectives: The overarching goals include boosting tourism as a means of fostering economic growth, generating employment, and showcasing the unique offerings of Assam to visitors.

In view of the above, the committee recommends to build tourist lodges or Guest Houses in every district with full security.	The Tourism department, Govt. of Assam with the objectives of giving a new dimension and thrust to rural home stay facility in the state of Assam and creation of self employment opportunity for educated youth in rural and semi urban areas of tourism potential and importance.  Till now 62 nos. of home stay facilities under Aamar Alohi Scheme have set up across Assam and it has become popular amongst tourist (Copy enclosed). Keeping with the growing demand Tourism department proposes to set up more such units of which budget provision has been kept. In the year 2022-23 the scheme is based on community basis i.e. a group of cluster of minimum 10 homestay units formed a community. In this connection, 5 nos. of proposals have been approved under Aamar Alohi Scheme viz. (1) Dima Hasao Association- Dima Hasao, (2) Umswai Valley Green & Clean Protection Committee- Karbi Anglong, (3) Dichang Welfare Foundation/ Siupaatpha Social Welfare- Charaideo, (4) Dihing Patkai SHG-Dibrugarh, (5) Chiram Social Foundation, Deori Community- Majuli.
		Further, 191 Homestays are also available in major districts of Assam viz. Kamrup(M), Bongaigaon, Majuli, Charaideo, Dibrugarh, Sivasagar, Lakhimpur, Dhemaji, Kamrup etc. (Copy enclosed). In addition to that, 19 nos. of Homestays are also available under Asomi Rural Homestay Scheme which is also reflected in the Official Website of Assam Tourism for the promotion of the same.
2	The committee observes that there are various tourist potentialities in the state. attracting more visitors/ tourists providing positive word of mouth publicity. Attractions are a core component of tourism. They are often called 'tourist attractions' because they tend to attract tourists. Therefore, the committee recommends to enhance fund position up to 1000 crore for the purpose.

In order to tap the immense tourism potential of the state which will not only create employment opportunities but also contribute to economy of the state, the Tourism department has already taken up the following schemes/activities namely:

The Department of Tourism, Assam has participated in various National Travel & Tourism Fairs, viz India Exhibition at 46th World Session of UNESCO Heritage Committee Meeting at New Delhi, IITF New Delhi, TTF Ahmedabad, Kolkata etc. and showcased Assam Tourism in the National & International level. Advertisements showcasing various aspects of Assam Tourism were placed as In-flight Branding in major airlines such as Air India, Vistara & Air Asia; additionally in the Railway Sectors for advertisement in the New Delhi Railway Stations & Katra Railway Hoardings at Goa Stations. promotional LED screens in inner and outer circles of Connaught Place and tourism promotional videos also aired are Advertisement of Assam Tourism at TV Today the platform. Network in Overseas Advertisement in the Social Media platform are also being made for the promotion of Assam Tourism in the national and international level.

International Tourism Mart, 2024: The International Tourism Mart, 2024 was held from 27<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2024 at Kaziranga. This prestigious event brought together travel industry leaders, stake holders and enthusiasts from across the globe to showcase Assam's potential as a world-class tourism destination. During the event, FAM Tour was organized incorporating the following itineraries:

- I) Kaziranga- Jorhat- Majuli
- II) Tezpur, Nameri and Manas National Park
- III) Umrangso & Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary

The Brahmaputra Carnival 2024-25, organized in the Bank of the river Brahmaputra, as an annual event

orchestrated by Assam Tourism, serves as a platform to spotlight the rich culture, traditions, handicrafts, and gastronomy of Assam and theothernortheasternstates. This vibrant celebration takes place as and barcreated by the majestic Brahmaputra River. For the promotion of the said Carnival, advertisements were published/aired both in print and electronic medias for wide publicity outside the state.

Advantage Assam 2.0:The Government of Assam's initiative hosting "Advantage Assam 2.0 – Investment and Infrastructure Summit 2025" on February 25-26, 2025, in Guwahati represents a significant endeavour which showcased the state's potential as a major investment destination.

The Government of Assam, under the leadership of Chief Minister Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma, has embarked on an ambitious journey to attract investments and drive industrial development to the state through the Advantage Assam 2.0 Investment and Infrastructure Summit.

Accordingly, roadshows had been organised in the following countries -

- (1) South Korea, Japan, and Singapore headed by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Assam Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma
- (2)Thailand & Malaysia headed by Hon'ble Minister Shri Keshab Mahanta.
- (3)UAE & UK headed by Hon'ble Minister Shri Bimal Bora

In addition to that, during Advantage Assam 2.0, thematic session for tourism was also organised for the promotion of Golf, River Cruise, Tea and Heritage Tourism in presence of National and International Audience.

17 nos. of MoUs had been signed during Advantage Assam 2.0 with a total amount of Rs. 2073.11 Cr. in different segments namely Hotel and Restaurants, Caravans, River Tourism Cruise Vessels, Ropeway Projects, Eco Friendly Cottages, Tourism Spa etc.

		To be more visible in the National and International platform, Tourism industry needs more budget provision for aggressive marketing for the promotion of Tourism Destinations of Assam.

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#### **OBSERVATION AND RECOMMENDATION**

#### **TOURISM**

#### Grant No. 65

After presentation of the Budget in the House for the Financial Year 2025-26 and after having a stimulating discussion on Preliminary status paper, Action Taken Report, the Committee made the following observations and Recommendations.

- 1. The Committee observes that there is lack of tourist lodges and homestays in many tourist hotspots of the state. Therefore, the Committee recommends to increase Budget allocation for "Amar Alohi Scheme" and also to build tourist lodges, guest houses or homestays in the districts which have tourist prospective.
- 2. The Committee observes that there are much more opportunities to promote our tourist places which are lesser known and have historical importance. Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Department should take necessary steps to promote all those places and also to promote hill areas viz Karbi-Anglong and Dima Hasao. Further, as requested by the Hon'ble MLA of Dibrugarh LAC, the Department take necessary steps to promote and develop Soraipung and Sitakund and also to promote Sindura picnic spot of Katigora as requested by the Hon'ble MLA of Katigora LAC.
- 3. The Committee recommends that the Department should take necessary steps to provide proper training of Tourist guides to the youth which will generate employment and also bring more development in the tourism sector.
- 4. The Committee recommends that the Department should take necessary steps to promote homestays of the Tourist destinations of the state.
- 5. The Committee observes the need of an Online Portal. Therefore, the Committee recommends online portal so that the tourist from different places can book or access their lodges and homestays in advance.
- 6. The Committee observes that the Department is facing shortage of fund allocations for promotion and advertisement of Tourist places. Therefore, the Committee recommends that the Budget allocation should be increased in the Department especially for advertisement and overall development of the Department.

7. The Committee recommends spot visit comprehensive tours to have a deeper understanding of the tourism hotspots.

The Committee recommends that the Budget allocation under Grant No. 65 for the Financial Year 2025-26 be for the Tourism Department be approved by the august House.

The Action taken Report on the recommendations may be submitted to the Committee within 90(ninety) days from the date of presentation of the Report in the House.

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
