(b) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or any action taken under the Ordinance as repealed shall be deemed to have been done or taken under this Act as if this Act had commenced on the thirteenth day of March, 1972 (date of promulgation of the Ordinance).

to provide for the withdrawal of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Assam to the service of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973.

It is hereby enacted in the Twenty third Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

Short title 1.(1 This Act may be called the Assam Appropriation and commencement, (No,II) Act, 1972.

- (2) The Act shall come into force with effect from 1st Ap.il, 1972.
- Withdrawal of Rs.2,81,83, State of Assam there may be paid and applied sums out of the not exceeding those specified in column (3) of the Sche-Gonsolidated dule amounting in the aggregate [inclusive of the sum Fund of Assam for the sam for the Assam Appropriation (Vote on Account Act), 1971] to the sum of rupees (eighty-three crores two hundred eighty-one lakhs, and nine hundred towards defraying the several charges which will come in course of pay ment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of Morch, 1973 in respect of the services specified in column (2) of the Schedule.

Appropriation:

3. The sums authorised to be paid and applied from and out of the Consolida ed Fund of the State of Assam by this Act, shall be appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the Schedule in relation to the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973.
